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
From the President

NCCC Scholarship Information

The NCCC Scholarship program is funded through donations from Clubs, individuals and corporate friends, such as Mid America Motorworks. They are also exercising an option on 55 + acres of land on the east side of the interstate. They are looking to put in a ¹/₄ mile drag strip, a 1.2 mile road course and an autocross pad. This will be treated as a capital project although he thinks they will be borrowing the money to purchase this land and it is \$870,000, which does not include the clearing, developing etc. This is going to be very expensive. The NCM thinks they will have people coming down and running events there, and they may, they also believe they will be able to rent this track out for training and driving schools.

Dick passed out a packet of information having to do with Corvette Homecoming. Lexington had horses, Chicago had cows, and Bowling Green is going to have Corvettes. The first one out will be a 57, then 63, 68, C5 and Z06. These will be scaled down versions 5 ft long, 2 ft wide and 18 in tall. The deal is you buy this thing and you put it on display. They then auction it off to someone. The monies go to the Warren County Red Cross. The advantage for some club buying one is \$400 will go to your local Red Cross chapter. They were hoping maybe Council would look at buying one but since we are upside down on our budget this year we are not going to be affording the \$3,000.

Dick took this opportunity to once again thank John McGee, Betty Parks, Jim Krebs, the folks that came down to work from East Ohio, the Dawleys, the folks that came over from the Carolina region, and the Nashville Corvette Club. This was a convention that was put on by many for your enjoyment, so we certainly hoped you enjoyed it. We also hope you realize we did this for a real good friend.

Old Business

Bob brought the nominating committee up to the podium, Pat Brown, Patsy Shearer and Diane Bowen. Bob offered to read the job descriptions but no one requested this to be done, if interested you can go to the web page to read.

Pat Brown – for the office of the VP of Competition from the June governor's meeting we have a nomination, Jack Wilson. Opened the floor for additional nominations for VP of Competition. No additional nominations. Motion to close the nomination by Allen Morris with a second by Alan Smith. No discussion. Motion passed.

Patsy Shearer –for the office of Secretary, Cindy Urenda from Aurora Colorado, a member of the Denver Corvette Association and member of the Rocky Mountain Region for seven years. She has been President of the Denver Corvette Association for eight years, Webmaster one year and Vice President two years. Opened the floor for additional nominations, none offered. Motion to close the nomination by Alan Smith with a second by Larry Hickman. No discussion, motion passed.

Diane Bowen -Nomination for Sgt. at Arms, Gary Foster. No other nominations. Gary is the current Sgt. at Arms. Motion to close by Alan Smith with second by Allen Morris. No discussion, motion passed.

For the office of Business Manager, we have three candidates, George Gallant from the East Region, Dennis Patrick from the East Ohio Region and Manny Montgomery from the Florida Region. No additional nominations for this position. Motion to close by Alan Smith and second by Larry Hickman. No discussion, motion passed.

Each of these candidates came up and gave a short speech as to their qualifications. (Refer to the website for their bio).

Jack Wilson also came up to speak and shared his qualifications for the office of VP of Competition.

Gary Foster could not be with us today as he is interviewing for a police chief job and Cindy had other commitments.

Presentations for the meeting sites for 2010-2012 have to be to the RMD's by the November meeting.

No other old business.

New Business

Hal Bellamy reported on the site inspections for the two convention prospects, Grand Rapids MI. and Colorado Springs, CO.

Grand Rapids – you go to the Amway Grand Plaza Hotel. They call it grand for a reason, because it is. They have five restaurants ranging from a deli to jackets and ties. Traffic in and out is an easy deal, from the airport about 10-15 minutes; it is a pay shuttle to get in from the airport. In the city, Grand Rapids downtown is an interesting place has been pretty well overhauled, a lot of restaurants, entertainment places. As far as the other facets of the city area the hotel is a high class place, this needs to be noted. The track facility for both the high and low speed are very competent, the drag race site is a beautiful place, no problem. Parking for Grand Rapids is offsite, probably a 10 minute walk. There will be a shuttle service and cars are going to park in the parking garage across the street. His opinion is this is a very traditional well organized racer convention.

Colorado Springs has the Crowne Plaza Hotel, has three restaurants ranging from a deli to an upscale bar/restaurant type. Has indoor and outdoor pools, the airport is 10-15 minutes away and offers a free shuttle. This free shuttle will also take you around town. Shopping and eating is very close. They have a facility capable of having the in door Concours, liberal on their policy for flags and banners. The tracks are Bandimere Speedway which we have run before, very capable place, high speed at Pueblo Motorsports Park which is adequate. The low speed is an interesting location, right across the street from the hotel. You can walk out your hotel room or look out the window and watch what is going on over there. The Hotel has a 550 car parking lot and in addition a grass field where you could park a lot of semis. You can look out your window and see Pikes Peak. He thinks what we have here is basically what he would describe as a vacation resort. Both are very capable facilities.

Allen Morris asked a question about the parking at either of these hotels-can he easily walk to his corvette and go somewhere and also for trailer parking. Hal responded that at the Colorado Springs venue parking would not be a problem they have plenty of places to park. The situation is really the same at Michigan but for the rigs is not; the parking is a couple of blocks away. The car parking for your corvette is right across the street, will be in a parking garage. When he was there they charged to park. You will have a very nice time at either venue; it is a matter of where you want to go and how you want to do it.

Presentation then given for the convention proposal in Michigan. (Refer to the NCCC website for full details of the proposal).

Dick announced the teller committee; there will be four from the RMD's, four from the RE's and four members at large. The representatives from the RMD's, are Diane Bowen, Patsy Shearer, Sue Puksich, and Joe Vasta. Reps from the RE's, are Jerry Limpach, Jack Carkner, Mike Weil and Bernyce Molenda. Reps from the members at large are George Powell, Jim Thomas, Don Parks and Dennis Luther. Motion to accept the appointment of this teller committee was made by Allen Morris with a second by Larry Higgins. No discussion motion passed.

Presentation then given for the convention in Colorado. (Refer to the NCCC website for full details of the proposal).

Dick asked for a motion to appoint Betty Parks as the 2008 convention treasurer. A motion made by John McGee with a second by Manny Montgomery. No discussion, motion passed.

Dick then called Betty up to the podium and presented her with the 2007 President's award.

Dave Heinemann read the three by-law changes that are to be voted on. They are as follows:

1. ARTICLE VIII

Meetings SECTION 1. Notice of Meetings. Original:

A <u>written</u> notice of each regular and special meeting of the Board of Governors stating the time, place, date and purpose thereof shall be <u>mailed</u> by the Secretary of the Corporation to each governor. <u>Written</u> notices shall be mailed at least twenty-one (21) days prior to the date of such meeting.

Proposed change that you will be voting on in the mail

A notice of each regular and special meeting of the Board of Governors stating the time, place, date and purpose thereof shall be <u>sent</u> by the Secretary of the Corporation to each governor. Notices shall be <u>sent</u> at least twenty-one (21) days prior to the date of such meeting.

What was changed is we took out written and put in sent. It now covers any way we want to send it, electronically or written. The current rule forces us to have a written notice. We are trying to cut cost of mailing and that is what has been changed basically, two words, eliminated mail and took out written and written and put in sent.

2. Article IX, Section 5, Convention Proceeds of the Bylaws.

At the last meeting in May we put a standing rule in to eliminate convention reserve fund. There was a fund set aside of \$20,000. National is responsible for any convention losses whether there is a reserve or not. It was recommended by the steering committee we would remove that reserve so now the by-laws have to be cleaned up. The current rule reads:

The corporation and the host organization shall share equally in the annual convention proceeds. The next sentence is what we are eliminating. **The Corporation share shall be placed in a convention reserve fund**. The Corporation shall reimburse the host organization for losses incurred; however should the loss result from the host



organization's non-compliance of the Convention Steering Committee recommendation(s), the host organization shall be responsible for that expenditure. A loss will be reviewed by the Convention Steering Committee for a determination of responsibility; the decision of the Convention Steering Committee may be appealed to the Board of Governors.

3. This one is a little lengthy, article 11 Section 3. What we have added is in the 5^{th} line to include –two weeks prior.... ARTICLE XI Section 3.

Duties Regional Executive Committee

The Regional Executive committee shall be comprised of the elected/appointed Regional Executive from each Region. The immediate Past President and Parliamentarian shall be non-voting members. This committee shall be chaired by the immediate Past President or an individual elected from the ranks of the Regional Executive committee. Any proposed revision, amendment, or repeal to the corporate By-Laws shall first be referred to this committee to review and make recommendation(s) based on technical application, if necessary [correct Article, Section, etc., resolve any conflict with other articles, suggest language changes (with the permission of the author) which do not change the original intent of the proposal].. After due investigation and review, the findings of the committee shall be presented, without prejudice, to the Board of Governors at the regularly scheduled business meeting following the annual meeting or a special meeting called for such purpose. The committee shall retain a permanent record of all resolutions passed during the year by the Board of Governors. The committee shall also review financial matters presented by the Finance committee and other duties as assigned by the Executive Board

Proposed:

Regional Executive Committee

The Regional Executive committee shall be comprised of the elected/appointed Regional Executive from each Region. The immediate Past President and Parliamentarian shall be non-voting members. This committee shall be chaired by the immediate Past President or an individual elected from the ranks of the Regional Executive committee. Any proposed revision, amendment, or repeal to the corporate By-Laws shall first be referred to this committee 2 weeks prior to the first meeting of the year, to review and make recommendation(s) based on technical application, if necessary [correct Article, Section, etc., resolve any conflict with other articles, suggest language changes (with the permission of the author) which do not change the original intent of the proposal].. After due investigation and review, the findings of the committee shall be presented to the Board of Governors at the regularly scheduled business meeting following the annual meeting or a special meeting

called for such purpose. The committee shall retain a permanent record of all resolutions passed during the year by the Board of Governors. The committee shall also review financial matters presented by the Finance committee and other duties as assigned by the Executive Board

All we have put in is a time when it needs to be submitted to the RE committee. In the RE description of by-law proposals there was a never a time line of when one was to be submitted. Someone could submit a by-law last night and it isn't appropriate for us to deal with it on the spur of the moment. So we put in a provision that by-law considerations must be submitted by the first meeting of the year to allow the RE's at least two meetings to digest it, check it, verify it and make sure it does not conflict and then present it to you at the meeting after the annual meeting which is this meeting.

These are the only three changes we are going to make. They are basically cleanup items to make things work a little more efficiently and flow a little better.

There were no questions; this will be in the ballots to vote on. Cal Camp made a motion (see attached) to modify article 8 section 1 re notice of meeting, article IX section 5 re convention proceeds, and article XI section 3 duties of the RE committee. This motion was seconded by Bernyce Molenda. No further discussion. This will be voted on in the ballots that will be sent out.

The ballots will be sent out by the end of the month, September 30th and must be postmarked back to the secretary by October 31st, for the vote to count.

Mike Godfrey -Rulebook Proposal - Mike thanked all of the RCD's and the proxy RCD's that have worked on this rulebook. They have done a lot of serious work and have done work even outside the meetings, with a lot of communication through emails, a lot of thought put into what they have done. They ran a little short on time, it was his understanding that this had to be presented at this meeting however he did not realize it was supposed to be voted on at this meeting.

What he has is the rulebook consisting of the working copy they had last night plus all of his notes. So that is what he has to present for consideration. At this time he will entertain a motion. Manny Montgomery, RCD of the Florida Region North Florida Corvette Association made the motion that the rulebook package as presented by the competition committee be approved. It is seconded by Howard Curtis of Elkhart Vette Set. Opened the floor for discussion. 1st comment was that this is in violation of the by-laws as individual copies have not been provided to the governors. Manny Montgomery made a motion that the voting on the rulebook be suspended until the next meeting. This was seconded by Howard Curtis. Mike then commented his original plan was he will take this, put it all together when he gets home as fast as he can do it, it will go out to his RCD's to have a short period to review it to make sure he did not miss anything and then it would be distributed to all the governors via email through the secretary to be voted on in the November meeting.

Further discussion on this issue. Calvin Camp made a second motion, to see how this works with the one Manny just made -was told we have to do something with the motions already on the floor. So changed to part of the discussion he recommends the 2004-2007 rulebook be extended for one year that will give everyone time to review it to work through it as we do not want to rush something in to the rules that we have to deal with next year. Mike thinks extending this for a year is too long, by voting on this in November it would start the first of the year. We have to get a vote on the suspension that is on the floor – Dick – we have a motion on the floor to accept this rulebook. We have a motion on the floor to suspend the vote on this motion until the November meeting. The suggestion at this point is that we vote on the suspension. If the suspension fails we go back and vote on the presentation of the rulebook. If the presentation fails we are under the current rulebook until we come up with a new rulebook, and by voting on the presentation, motion 1, we fulfilled the obligations of the book and we can come back, Mike can do all the work, send it out to everyone, have it ready for November and we start over again. So what we should do is just withdraw the suspension and just go to the vote.

Bernyce questioned if you are to give a copy of the rulebook to the governors what is the deadline that you will have this to them in order for them to review it and vote on. The governors still have to get it to their members. Mike plans on getting this out by the end of this month which gives you well over a month to look it over. Arnie can not believe that this body of governors would pass a rulebook that it has not seen so if you want to take a vote, let's take a vote. He is worried about the time frame also as this is going to be sent to the competition people then to go out to the governors and then he has to go to his club, depending on when his club meeting is those people should have a right to know what is in that rulebook and have some input into this. Mike commented that is why he is trying to get it sent out; his aim is to get to the governors by the end of this month, which means he has to get it to the RCD's to look over before that.

Manny stated as a member of the RCD committee people may be thinking there is a lot of changes to the rulebook, there is not, it is just easier to read. It has been laid out differently so you can actually find stuff in the rulebook. Manny withdrew his motion for a suspension. No more discussion, called the question on the original motion by Don Schmitt. Dick read the original motion, the rulebook package as presented by the competition committee to be approved, signed by Manny Montgomery with a second by Howard Curtis. Called for a vote on all those in favor of presenting the rulebook as presented –motion defeated. This will be presented again in November. We are under the current rulebook until 12/31/07, will vote on the new rulebook in the November meeting to be effective January 1^{st} 2008.

Dave asked for Kevin to make a motion to make this clean that once all the copies are received and reviewed by all governors we will vote on this in November. Kevin made the motion that Mike send out an electronic copy to all governors to be reviewed and voted on at the November meeting. Howard Curtis seconded this motion. Motion passed.

Dick commented that last year at a November meeting Roger had called a motion that we give amnesty to clubs that had for whatever reason not sent their proxies in for attendance. He will be asking for a similar motion at the November meeting. The reason he is bringing this up at this meeting is so that the RE's will have a chance to get to any of their clubs that have not submitted proxies for whatever reason and we can get those in and presented at the November meeting for attendance only. That will clean up one of the little standing rules that we have about how we treat clubs in good standing. He has also ask Dave and the RE's for the November meeting to look at ways for cleaning up that rule so we no longer have this problem.

Deb Murphy- Talked about the budget for 2008; we wanted to make sure we had some realistic numbers in the budget. Last year we tweaked membership a little bit, to Bob's dismay, so we would not be so far in the hole. We did not do that this year. The budget we have now is realistic numbers that we are projecting to spend. Thankfully we have been fiscally responsible and we have not spent what we have estimated. It doesn't mean we are padding the budget, so take a look at it. If you have questions please email them to Deb Murphy, she has more information than anyone could ever want.

This budget will be voted on and this budget will be included in the minutes. Keep in mind these are our best guess these are not actual numbers. Some discussion on this budget vs. the projected and actual.

Deb stated she would be happy to put something together to get in the minutes if you want to see actual year end totals for a couple of years. But keep in mind to be fiscally responsible we do the budgets to make them our best guess at what we expect as income and for expenses. Thankfully last year in our budget we had estimated that we were going to be at a negative. We ended up with \$30,000 in net income last year over what we expected, in the black. So we did not spend as much as we thought we would. That is what the budgets are all about. We are trying to make our best guess on what we expect to spend and all she is trying to do is compare what we have estimated in the last three years so



you can see. If you want actual's she will try to get together for the minutes but keep in mind a budget is our best guess for next year. The actuals for 2006 and 2007 as far as she can go, will be in the minutes as well as the projected 2008 budget.

No more new business.

Betty Parks commented on what the Southeast region is doing for Sue McGee –they have established a Sue McGee memorial scholarship and are taking donations, it will be a living tribute to Sue. In her honor, not to offend anyone, as Sue never wanted to offend anyone, they have asked Patrick, because the scholarship committee is the one that is going to award the Sue McGee memorial scholarship, that the first criteria for consideration of the candidate is that it has to be someone from the South. Sue just did not like those damn Yankees! All kidding aside they are setting up the scholarship. Sue was interested in the law field and they are considering that, if no one qualifies it will go into the general scholarship. For anyone that is interested they are taking donations, please make checks out to NCCC, Southeast region.

50/50 winner was Jerry Limpach and the amount was \$163.00.

Meeting adjourned at approximately 5:00pm.

GLASS CITY CORVETTE CLUB CELEBRATES 40 YEARS

TOLEDO – It all started in a barn.

Ten people, all Corvette owners, sat around on benches to chat, no matter the weather outside. "We'd all take the change out of our pockets to donate for the kerosene," Gary Bedra remembered. The year was 1966, and no one there could have imagined how far those barn meetings would go. Those memories and a thousand others were still fresh 40 years later.

The Glass City Corvette Club gathered members young and old for a reunion June 10, 2006. "Everybody that joined the club had that one interest, that common interest, that common thread, which was the Corvette," Mike Deibler said, standing in the center of the Maumee Theater's reception hall. Water dripped from the Corvette ice sculpture as memories, and sometimes tears, flowed freely. About 90 people, some of whom sold their Corvettes years ago, dined and reminisced.

"This is really super. It brings back a lot of the past," eightyear member Dewey Hall said. "You've got a certain amount of the group that are at every meeting. It's a family club, which is nice. It's not strictly for guys. This is a really classy event."

Carl Schmidt Chevrolet became the club's major sponsor in 1970, serving as host for decades of meetings. As grateful as the club was, though, it was a two-way street.

"I appreciate what they've done for me. The day I retired, they all came up in their Corvettes and paid tribute to me," Bob Schmidt, Carl's son and an original club member, said.

Steve Sparks recalled the earlier days of the club, when members would get their Corvettes out on racetracks and try their hands. "It cost us five bucks to run at the speedway all day," he said. Later days included various rallyes, including a few that ran more than a little long, at times.

Members traded plenty of stories over old photographs



before dinner, from tales of men in tutus to work for the Spina Bifida Foundation. "This is great, it really is, and people that you never would expect to be here are here," Mike Deibler said. "We've spent a lot of time with the club. Lots of memories. It was a big part of our life."

Bedra almost didn't come to the reunion. He now lives in Fort Myers, FL, but as the big day drew near, he found it impossible to stay away. "I wasn't going to come, and the last two weeks, I'd wake up at 3 in the morning and have flashbacks, good flashbacks, about all the people. We had so much fun together, and nobody ever hurt anybody," Bedra said.

And there are plenty of people who keep the club going strong today.

"I've made a lot of friendships through this group, and we're telling a lot of stories, and we're making our own right now," Shawn Jacobs said.

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


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ABOUT THE BACK COVER



The back cover photo was taken at the University of Montana Oval, which is the hub of the campus. This is a small portion of the 77 members and 68 Vettes in the Hellgate Corvette Club, Inc.

The Hellgate Corvette Club, Inc. was chartered in 1972. The general purpose of the club is to promote interest in the Corvette and to promote restoration, parts exchange, touring and active affiliation with other Corvette owners and with other Corvette clubs. The term "Hellgate" was chosen as the name of the Corvette club to honor the Hellgate Canyon.

The name Hellgate came from the reputation of being a place of lurking danger to human life after many battles between the Salish/Flathead Indians who claimed the region as their homeland from their beginning as a nation and the Blackfeet Indians who invaded the Salish/Flathead at the mouth of the canyon. At times, the westward flowing river was stained red with blood of the battles as the warriors—either Salish/Flathead or Blackfeet—tried to get away from each other during the many battles. The Salish/Flathead were known as a peaceful nation and the Blackfeet were well known as plunderers and scalpers.

The Salish/Flathead would use the Hellgate canyon to go east of the mountains to hunt buffalo. Traders and trappers who came through the canyon in later years would find human skulls and horse bones strewn in the vicinity of the canyon. The British and American fur traders used the term Hell Gate or Hells Gate as it gained the reputation of being a dangerous place.

David Thompson of the Northwest Company of Canada—a fur trader, explorer and cartographer—put the name "Nemissoulatakoo" on his map of the area. The word Missoula was retained from the old name as a county name by the Legislature of the Territory of Montana in 1864-65.

The mountain to the south of the canyon was called "Es-mock" and Esh-mock" by the Salish/Flathead and meant a high point and lookout place.

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After settlers arrived in the 1860's, it was called Mount Sentinel. The northern wall of the canyon was called "Si-nim-koo," which meant a big bump, an obstacle or something in the way. The slope of "Si-nim-koo" was visualized as resembling an elephant's back and thus became known as Mount Jumbo.

The river that flows through the canyon has had several local names— Missoula River and Hell Gate River being the most notable. It was officially named Clark Fork of the Columbia in honor of William Clark. On his return trip from the Pacific Ocean in 1806, Meriwether Lewis took this river to the junction of the Clark Fork and the present day Blackfoot River and then an old Indian trail to the Missouri River. He was the first white man to enter the notoriously dangerous canyon.

In 1855, the U. S. Government requested that the Salish/Flathead Indian Nation and the Blackfeet Indian Nation sign a peace treaty. The signing took place at the present-day Council Groves, a few miles west of Missoula.

Many different groups of people traveled through the canyon after Lewis in 1806 in their quest for a new life/challenges. Captain John Mullan was in charge of building a road from Fort Benton on the Missouri River to Walla Walla, WA in 1860 that passed through the Hellgate canyon. The road was completed in 1862. There are several businesses in the Missoula area with the name Hellgate and even two schools.




Short History of Cumberland Valley Corvette Club

The Cumberland Valley Corvette Club was established in 1965 by a small group of Corvette owners from the Carlisle Pennsylvania area who would meet in a local mall parking lot on Sunday afternoon and swap stories or cruise around. By 1967 the club was growing and had a program of monthly meetings and road rallyes established. It was then a decision was made to incorporate the club. By 1970 CVCC had discovered the National Council of Corvette Clubs and sent a representative to the meeting in Akron, Ohio and joined NCCC. During the 1970's in addition to rallyes there was also an interest in doing low speed events and the club sponsored a very successful series. As the end of the 70's approached showing their Corvettes became very popular with some club members and concourse events rounded us out into a complete club to fill every interest.

By the 1980's the club grown past the 100 member mark and was becoming more socially active. While CVCC always took day trips and cruses we started having more picnics and weekend trips, which continue to this day. The club also became more aware of supporting charitable causes. We began to support the Spina Bifida Association of Greater Pennsylvania and continue to, along with other charitable organizations. As the decade came toward an end CVCC supported the East Regions first bid to host a national convention in the Poconos, using the facilities at the Pocono International Raceway for the low and high speed events. The club agreed to put on the high speed event and to insure success we ran two high speed events at Pocono in 88 & 89 prior to the 1990 convention. In 1994 we decided to make use of Pocono International Raceway again, this time for a driving school to allow entrants to run their cars at high speeds on a closed course under controlled conditions and with proper instruction for novices. This has proved very popular and sells out within a month of registration opening.

By the turn of the century the club had been in existence for 35 years and it was decided in order to mark the occasion we would purchase a 35th anniversary Corvette to raffle off and donate the profits to charity. Through the efforts of many club members we were able to donate over \$2000 to local charities. By now our membership was over 200 and many members were participating in region events. While the club had always been active in the region, always near the top in points, we had never won a region championship in almost thirty years. This has changed with 5 region championships and a top 15 nationally to date. In the year 2005 the club celebrated its 40th year with another raffle car. Naturally this was a 40th anniversary Corvette and profits were donated to charity. In 2003 the East Region



hosted the NCCC convention in Hagerstown Maryland and once again CVCC did the High Speed event, this time at Summit Point Raceway in West Virginia.

The club has always been involved in Corvettes at Carlisle since it is held in our back yard. In the recent past

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we have done a Road Rallye and presently we have an Autocross/car control school on a small track on the fairgrounds. This has been very well received over the past three years and we look forward to hosting the event in the future. One event the club members are involved in, without using their Corvettes, is a Mini Grand Prix where go-karts have formula car type bodies and are raced around parking lots wheel to wheel. We are responsible for corner workers and pit stewards which can be a lot of fun. Another fun thing, and profitable for our charity fund, is



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
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Greetings from the East Region!

The Circle City Corvette Club Celebrates 30 Years of Corvette Fun

The word 'milestone' has two distinctive meanings. One definition of a milestone is a stone pillar at a roadside showing distance in miles to various places. On the other hand, a milestone could be defined as a very important event or a significant point in time.

In 1977, around Labor Day, a group of Corvette enthusiasts organized a Corvette club sponsored by the local AM radio station WIFE and Circle Chevrolet, located in downtown Indianapolis. When both of the sponsoring entities dissolved, this "WIFE" Corvette club merged with the Central Indiana Corvette Club and was renamed the Circle City Corvette Club (CCCC). The CCCC and all of its members joined the National



Council of Corvette Clubs (NCCC), the largest national Corvette association. For the last 30 years, CCCC has been a part of and supported the NCCC since its creation as IN-281 in 1977.

Our club membership has grown from a dozen or so members to 150+ members today and growing daily. The CCCC continues to support their charter objectives of enjoying and promoting "America's Sports Car" and giving back to the community. We accomplish these objectives by sharing our enthusiasm for the Corvette through car shows, attending driveand-dines, and donating to charities. The CCCC also supports the National Corvette Museum (NCM) in Bowling Green, KY through donations, as well as providing labor during our annual "Work Weekend" at the museum. The NCM is the only national museum dedicated to just one car. Inside the NCM, there are numerous benches, plaques and bricks that thank the CCCC for various donations and for having a lifetime business membership to the NCM. Outside of the museum shows the CCCC commitment through the numerous bricks and even a plaque on the two-story air conditioning unit behind the main building thanking CCCC for painting it.

Our community benefits from CCCC through donations

to causes such as Riley's Hospital for Children, MDA, Junior Achievement of Central Indiana, Gleenors food bank, Eidlewild riding stables for handicapped children and frequent private family crisis donations.

To celebrate our significant 30 year milestone, CCCC hosted a "Sunset in Paradise" party on June 9, 2007 where the members were able to relax to tropical music, magic, great food and fireworks. Over the evening, the majority of members in



attendance met with Gary Cockriel, Manager of Guest Services and the Delivery Manager, for the NCM. Gary and his wife, Torie, came to share in the festivities with CCCC. Gary also presented to the club a plaque expressing appreciation of the club's support of the Museum and congratulating the club for 30 years of success. In addition, a letter from NCCC President Richard Yanko congratulating CCCC on this milestone of 30 years was read to the members in attendance.

Milestones in 1977 included the first airing of "Roots" on television; the death of the king, Elvis Presley; the Yankees winning the World Series and, for the first time, you could order a state-of-the-art eight-track player for your Corvette. From the 210 hp in 1977 to the 505 hp of a Z06 today, the Corvette has changed. Club members come and go; new generations of Corvette owners are born every day. For the CCCC, logos have been updated and events have changed, but the love of a Corvette remains the reason to join a club. The ability to help either locally or at a national museum is the reason to stay in a club. From the formation of IN -281 back in 1977 to the e-mail address we use today, the enthusiasm and love for the Corvette as it passes you on the road. As it was then and still is today, **WHAT A RIDE!!!**


