Vice President Membership

Governors' Meeting Minutes - November 10, 2007

Dick Yanko - President

Dick called the meeting to order at 1:05 p.m. and welcomed all to St. Louis. We then had the pledge of allegiance. Members that have passed since the last meeting were announced – Dick Sutton of Tin Hall Toys with the SW Region, Richard McDunn with Electric City Corvette Club, and Marvin Jensen of North Florida Corvette Association. Marvin was a past FL RCD and VP of Competition. This was followed by a moment of silence. Dick asked that we also take another moment of silence for all our friends and fellow members who are having their own personal battles with disease and for our troops who are off serving our country.

Dick introduced the Executive Board, the 2008 Convention Director, Ron Ruston, and the 2008 Convention treasurer Betty Parks, The introduction of the Regional officers and proxies was then made.

Dick asked for a motion to pay the proxy officers, motion made by Allen Morris with a second by Larry Hickman. No discussion, motion carried.

Officer Reports

Carolyn Montgomery - Secretary

No corrections to the September minutes. No comments, questions. Motion made by Don Schmitt to accept the minutes as written with a second by Bernyce Molenda. No discussion, motion passed, minutes accepted as written.

As this was the secretary's last meeting she commented that this has been a very interesting four years and she appreciated everyone being so kind. She knows that all will be as kind to the new incoming secretary Cindy Urenda.

Gary Foster - Sgt. at Arms

He apologized for running out of beverages in the hospitality room, at the last meeting he over bought and trying to watch the budget, this time he under bought. He will do better next time. He sent a real special thanks to the St. Louis Corvette Club for taking care of munchies last night, they did a great job.

Bob Bowen - VP of Membership

Covered the reports, there are 19,075 members as of last Thursday 11/8 and this is the highest we have been since this meeting of 2004. The meeting site presentations will be made in February and we will vote on those in May. We have had two submittals, one from St. Louis where we are today, and one from the convention hotel in Nashville. The presentations will be in February for you to decide on as to where we are going to meet for 2010-2012.

He gave out three membership awards – this year they divided these as we have clubs varying in size. The categories were more than 100 members and under 100 members. The award for the highest % increase in members for fewer than 100 members for 2007 goes to the Hot Nevada Vettes Corvette Club of the West Coast region. Cliff Harris accepted the award. For the club over 100 members for the highest % increase in members for 2007, this award went to Northern Virginia Corvette Club of the East Region. Then an award to the RMD that recruited the most new members goes to Elvira from the West Coast region, Cliff Harris. The awards are sponsored by the Mid America Motor Works and are called the Dolphin awards.

Rhonda Higgins – Distribution

It's time for renewals and she is ready and excited. Last meeting we talked about having the extra 2007 pins, she did bring them and the RMD's have them. If you need some for yourself or your members see your RMD. Also the RMD's were given or mailed this week the 2008 pins and calendars. They have them, she does not. She is putting a note in the packet that says do not contact her for these items as she does not have them. So as governors they were given to you as you turn in your renewals so the note will say please contact your club governor to get your calendar and pin, one calendar and one pin per member.

<u>Debbie Lindsey – Director of Sponsorship</u>

She has sent out the sponsorship packets and so far has sponsors from Bridgestone and Kumho. It is a little slow but the packets just went out in October so hopefully by February will have a much better idea of where monies will be coming from.

She has an interesting proposal from Hagerty Insurance Company; they do specialty car insurance and they may be providing a special offer for those who are coming to convention if you register by the first cut off. She is not sure about the specific details but something along the line they will issue you a special card and you will have a special package where if your car breaks down on the way to convention within 50 miles you can get your car towed and they will provide \$100 in roadside assistance. You will be able to get more information about this once it is available on the website.

There is a change in the credit card program coming up, it will still be with Bank of America but is going to a rewards program where you will earn points that can be used for purchasing. This can be used for airline mileage, car rentals etc and there will be more information coming out about this. She has given the contract for this to Hal, the business manager to look at and once we sign this the program will start up with the next offering. You will receive an information sheet in the membership packet and there will be a number to call if you want to sign up for the credit card. The rebate we get from them is \$30. If you sign up through the information that we send out NCCC receives a \$30 rebate, if you sign up from a mailing we only receive \$1 so we want to be sure we go the \$30 route. Please pass this on to your members.

The special discount for member's page continues on the website and she wants to remind you about the Choice Hotel program. They wanted you to know they are offering a special through November 30th so those that may be traveling through the Thanksgiving holidays may want to look at this site.

Some of our platinum level sponsors may be doing some advertising through our email. The secretary will be sending out some notes soon. All of the governors, regional officers etc will be receiving an email from Goodyear and she asks you as governors or within your club to please pass this on to each member via email. This is going to be more of the way we go as more and more advertise via email instead of hard copy. She asks that you try and forward this upcoming email to your members because it is an advantage, a gift certificate for them to use for tires.

Chuck Heretta had a question – you talk about the Bank of America which used to be MBNA, did they or did they not give us a rebate for purchases that we made using their card in the original program? Per Debbie, yes they did. Chuck asked if that was now suspended and is it only going to be the points to the individual person. Per Debbie, no, we will get both, but it will be at a reduced rate. The example that was given to her was that in the past the rebate was 5% of sales now rebating at 3%, however their experience with other groups they have done this with is that use of the card has increased by a minimum of 25% because now people are going to get rewards. In essence we should be better off or at least the same.

Dick asked Debbie what was required to be a platinum sponsor and her response was \$9,000. Dick ask the RE's and governors to tell the members that the emails they would be getting would be mostly coupon offers to save money, it is a good deal for you and it is a good deal for us.

Jim Harris - Convention Steering Committee

2007 Program - Reviewed the final financial report for the 2007 program and there was a profit of \$34,517.29. He did not go into a lot of detail re this but the profit was due to good turnout, good negotiation, buying smart etc, it all adds up.

2008 Program – After this meeting the bank account should be open with the advanced deposit money and ready to do business. One thing they are going to be doing in 2008 is to offer on-line registration in addition to the hard copy registration. The registration form will still be in your *Blue Bars*, and membership packets,

2009 Program – The voting results will be announced later in the program.

2010 Program – He has not had any serious inquiries about this program, if interested let him know and he will get you some information. You and anyone else are welcome to sit in on the steering committee meetings.

Ron Ruston gave an update on the 2008 program. The Southwest region wants all to come to Tulsa for the 2008 convention. The dates are June 21st through June 27th. Some of the highlights mentioned-drags will be at night, on Monday night, autocrosses at Hallett Motor Racing Circuit, thinks it is 1.8 miles, ten turns, lots of elevation changes, will run the low and high speed on the same day, will be out there for two days but you will come out one day and run both, will have some route 66 cruises, will be on the same day as the autocrosses. The awards banquet will be on Friday night, will be \$10 per head to eat, they cut the price to see if could get more people to stay and go to the banquet.

One thing that is being changed is the Top 15 awards for the competitors. This will be done on Sunday night in conjunction with the adult party; have not yet figured out all the details of how this will be done. Part of their thinking on this is these people work really hard to get this award so they are going to try and make it bigger and better than what would happen on Friday night. This will give them a little more recognition and let them walk around wearing their shirt every day if they want to.

The hotel reservations will be electronic, thanks to Walt Jenkins and he says this will work. They will also require that the reservations for the hotel come through the treasurer, hoping to do all of this electronically and

until you have your convention # from registration you can not get to the next level to do your hotel reservation.

So come to Tulsa, you will have a great time!

Patrick Dolan – Director of Charity

Patrick gave an update on Elana Siebel, who is being treated for cancer. She had surgery this past Monday and everything went well and better than expected. As soon as she is out of the hospital and healthy enough she will be undergoing more chemo. She thanks everyone for all of the cards, letters and support she is getting. Patrick provided the address for those that might want to send her a card - 8916 South 8th Street, Kalamazoo MI 49009-8940. Bill Siebel is the RE for Michigan and his address is in *Blue Bars* also.

They have received a request from the Windy City Corvette Club pertaining to a hardship for one of their members. This individual has had numerous back surgeries and has had other significant family crises. This individual certainly deserves this and the request was granted.

The transplant games will be July 11-16, 2008 and will be held in Pittsburg PA. The raffle car is the 2008 black coupe. The last show they went to was Effingham, Mid America Motorworks Funfest and he thanked all those that were there and helped work. NCCC was well represented by Public Relations and by Membership. Everyone worked really hard and they signed up some new members and also raised \$6,000. It was a very successful event. Debbie was able to secure a tire certificate from Goodyear Tires so a double raffle was done offering the tires to anyone that bought a ticket that weekend. Richard Breedlove from Morrisville IN won the tires.

Will be doing the 100% club program again – this is one \$10 ticket for everyone in your club. He has been asked as to what time one is considered a member. Is it at the start of the year? The bottom line on this program is to help raise money and to recognize the clubs that are supporting our charity program. If you send a check and indicate you have 32 members and the check is for \$320 they will trust that this is reasonably close to what your membership is at the time. She indicated this is when a convention makes money they pay to National the operating expenses back for their mileage and per diem that they are paid to come to the meeting. The deal then is the convention director is appointed the year before, so John McGee was appointed in 2006 and she had already closed those books so she really did not have any place to put this money. That is why it is in that category. The rest of it is to offset what we spent on his meeting expenses for this year. The other item we paid this last time which is on page 3 was for the convention *Blue Bars*, this was expensive but we are still a tad under budget so hopefully we are not going to be too far off under that.

Things are looking good this year, when you mind what you are doing and you make a little money on convention and you don't have a lot of unexpected expenses it looks real good. If you look at the balance sheet you also see the prepaid membership incentives which you get in your perks packets, those will show up in the prepaid membership incentives because those are for 2008. We have not paid for the pins yet; we have to pay whatever our sponsor doesn't pay.

John McGee, on behalf of the 2007 convention, gave Deb a check for \$34,517.

Hal Bellamy - Business Manager

With the 2008 insurance renewal there is a little bit of change. You will no longer be able to request a certificate from K&K without sending the money. They have had several cases where they have had a difficult time collecting the money after the certificate was issued. K & K can go back and cancel that certificate after the fact if the money does not get to them. Be sure you share this information with your members. He has not yet received the new premium for next year, should get this soon. We have had some claims.

He has distributed some reservation sheets for next year, the dates are good, and the phone #'s are good.

Pat Kelly – FCOA Director

She recently assigned FCOA# 3700. The grandfather of the four-year-old boy is a member of the Windy City Corvettes in the Midwest Region and the grandfather is well known in the region as DJ Thom. She thanked Windy City Corvettes for providing the notepads for the FCOA kids and Tejas Vettes from Southwest Region who had given her a check at the last meeting and will be used towards the 2008 dash plaques. She also thanked the FCOA kids from her club, Badger State Vettes. They have a concession stand at their speed events every year and the profits they make are donated to FCOA so they gave her some money. The chef, Gino Piacentine also a member of the club, grilled stuff and made side dishes for the FCOA kids to sell. She also received a check from Cedar Rapids Corvette Club.

She has been mailing out packets to FCOA and already is getting some back with incorrect addresses. Please make sure your members update addresses as this cost money to have to re-mail.

At the last meeting she had talked about the 2007 dash plaques in wanting to use the FCOA logo, which was going to end up being very expensive. She has talked to Tex from Desert Corvette Association who is the main sponsor of the plaques for 2007 and what they have decided to do is to have a combination dash plaque for 2007-2008. The kids will receive these early next year.

She has been working with Genene Patrick in looking for an inexpensive manufacture where she could get good quality but would not be costing FCOA an arm and leg. She has found someone and feels she can get the dash plaques for the kids at a fairly reasonable price. What she has done, since the kids do not have the dash plaques for this year, is to use the monies that were donated from her club to buy some rulers to put in the packets.

If you look at the FCOA membership report you will see that one of the regions has a 98% increase in membership, a big round of applause to the Florida Region. In the 10 years she has been doing this job, she has never had a region with this large of an increase. A lot of this has to do with the region RE and RMD and if you look at the last issue of *Blue Bars* and read the article from the Florida Region you will see their region is very aware that kids need to be encouraged and taught about Corvettes. There will also be something in an upcoming issue about a car show that was held in this region just for kids.

This year when membership started coming in for FCOA, she had kind of a slow start so thought she would make it through to next year with the membership cards and patches. NCCC Convention from a NON-Competitor Point of View

I am a second-generation member of NCCC, joining Corvette Cleveland when I was 19 (already 22 years ago!). I have attended a total of 20 Conventions. I competed at a few of them but, for the majority, my husband and I have just attended for the fun. If you've never been to a NCCC Convention, you really should consider it. Even if you do not plan to compete, there are plenty of things for you to do.

The first thing you MUST do upon arrival at the Convention site is to visit the Registration area. You need to sign the insurance waiver, pick up your goodie bag and, most importantly, pick up your Convention Badge. Your badge allows for entry into the week's parties and events.

Next, you should consider attending a few of the meetings. If you have any interest at all in becoming a Regional or National officer, or if you just want to see what goes on at the National level, you should attend a meeting. The committee and office-specific (RCD, RMD, etc.) meetings are generally held on Saturday evening, while the Governors' meeting is on Sunday. The most important meeting is the Convention Entrants' meeting, usually held after the Governors' meeting. Even if you don't compete, you will get needed information about parties, door-prize drawings, hospitality room, parking and spectator information for the competition events.

Now as for things to do during the week, that's up to you, but here are a few options. The number one activity you MUST do is to meet

other NCCC members! Talk to people from other regions; find out their history with NCCC and their interests. It is great to meet people who love Corvetting as much as we do. We have met so many nice people from all over the country!!! We now have friends, who are like extended family, in almost every state and we usually only see them at Convention. Email and NCCCnet have made keeping in touch easier, but it's nothing like talking to them in person at Convention. Hanging out by the pool or in the hospitality room are great places to meet other NCCC members.

Most Conventions are held in a city with plenty of sites to see. Sometimes the Convention plans formal side trips for the attendees, while at other times it is up to you to do a little research and find out what is around. At any rate, there is bound to be somewhere interesting you can visit. I personally don't like to shop, but that is also an option. For those too busy to browse a mall at home, you can explore a mall in the host city.

You can also shop at the Convention site. Each year they set up what is referred to as "Corvette Mall." Various vendors, Corvette related or not, set up stands in a Convention center room. Usually it is adjacent to the hospitality room. NCCC merchandise is available in Corvette Mall as well. The NCCC Charity committee also has a booth in Corvette Mall. They have a variety of raffle tickets available for purchase – for the NCCC/NKF raffle car—plus the other merchandise given away after Friday night's banquet. If you have a few hours to spare, the Charity committee could use some help manning their booth. Mike and I, and now our daughter, Andrea, try to help them out every year. Again, it's a good opportunity to meet people, plus support NCCC.

Then, there are the parties! A party is planned almost every night of Convention week. Sometimes they have a live band performing; other times it's a DJ. Usually there is a theme of some type for each of the parties. Sometimes people dress special for the parties – whether it's a custom t-shirt or a full-blown costume. The main goals are to have fun and to meet people! Friday evening's banquet is an additional cost, but it includes a formal sit-down dinner. It is also when the NCCC Competition Director presents the National Top 15 winners (ladies, men, and clubs) from the prior year with their awards. After that is over, the winner of the NCCC/NKF drawing is pulled, as well as the winners of the other charity committee prizes mentioned above.

If you are not a competitor, you are welcome to spectate at most of the events. (It's kind of hard for a rally.) The Convention program will have maps to all the venues so it's just a matter of getting yourself there. Usually the concours is at or near Convention headquarters. Lately, the funkhana has been a non-car event held at the host hotel. The speed event locations, of course, vary by host city, so sometimes they are close and other times it may take an hour or so to get to the track. Chair people are ALWAYS in need of workers, whether for a few hours or the whole day.

If you are not a racer and/or not able to bring your Corvette to Convention, you can still enter some of the events if you would like. Most years, they allow metal cars in the Rallye and the Funkhanas usually do not require a car at all. Even if you don't answer any of the Rallye questions, it is an excellent opportunity to sightsee in and around the host city. I can tell you from experience there are some scenic areas, nice homes and tourist type locations I would not have seen otherwise. Funkhanas are just that – fun. At times, the tasks require some skill while at other times just some luck is needed. It all depends on what the chairmen have in mind when they set it up.

CINCINNATI CORVETTE CLUB 50th ANNIVERSARY

The Cincinnati Corvette Club was formed in 1957 by

a few dedicated early Corvette owners and was one of the very first Corvette clubs to be established. Back then we were known as the Queen City Corvette Club. Today, we are proud



to be sponsored by the Joseph Chevrolet dealership on Colerain Avenue in Cincinnati and we are a Charter Member club of the National Council of Corvette Clubs (NCCC). On September 15, 2007, the Cincinnati Corvette Club celebrated its 50th Anniversary with a party in Cincinnati, Ohio, that included current and former club members, special guests, and other local Corvette enthusiasts.

Over 250 people browsed among the amazing cars and exhibits. 

More than 200 children have been adopted. The Gabriel House is not an adoption agency, but screens applicants and approves their appropriateness. 50 YEARS OF CHICAGO CORVETTE CLUB

The Chicago Corvette Club began when the Corvette was in its six model year – 1958. In Chicago, Keith Lais, Corvette owner and salesman at Ferrell Hicks Chevrolet, had been surveying other Corvette owners, through a variety of means including newspaper ads, to determine if enough people were interested in forming a club. On March 21, twenty-two people became members of the Chicago Corvette Club (CCC). The first meeting was held in the salesmen's meeting room at the Ferrell Hicks dealership, which became the clubs home for some time. Later on meetings were held at local restaurants, then for a period of time at the GM training center in Hinsdale, Illinois.

The new club acted quickly, electing temporary officers with Keith Lais as President and unanimously adopting the name "Chicago Corvette Club." Committees were formed at subsequent meetings to generate a constitution, club logo, jacket patches, stationery, membership cards and the club newspaper called the "Grand Prix." On June 28, 1958, the club held its first social banquet and installed its first permanent officers. The clubs first dues per member were \$15 and currently are just \$40. Membership grew to an active group of 35-40 members. The club wanted to hold its membership to under 100 members in order to maintain close working relationships.

The members' great enthusiasm expanded competition activities rapidly. In May of 1958, CCC held its first gymkhana open to all sports cars in the Chicago area. Concourses, rallies and economy runs quickly followed. Social events also grew. Two banquets were held

yearly, one to honor past and new club officers and a second to present the "Competitor of the Year" and "Member of the Year" awards. The club ran caravans to the St. Louis Corvette assembly plant and the Indy 500 race. Ken Bonser and his brother in law, John Fenton, owners of Clarendon Hills Auto Repair, held 'garage events' where members could work on their cars for free using their facilities. CCC held an annual picnic called "Christmas in July" which included a concourse for members, family and guests. There were also occasional house parties and non-automotive sports events. Our club spawned the formation of two new clubs, the original Windy City Corvette Club and the Northern Rays Corvette Club.

Other clubs devoted to the Corvette emerged nationwide. The idea arose of having a national organization of Corvette clubs. The Chicago Corvette Club was one of the key instruments in forming the resulting National Council of Corvette Clubs (NCCC) in January 1961. CCC is one of a very few charter members of NCCC and indeed much of NCCC's present structure; even the design of the steering wheel logo, was drawn from that of the Chicago Corvette Club. William Burda, our club member and NCCC's first treasurer, set up a bank account at the Bank of Elmhurst

that served formally as NCCC's bank into the 1980's.

The Chicago Corvette Club, over a rich 50-year history, has sponsored many unique events, many of them "firsts." CCC sponsored the first car club speed events in several Illinois parking lots at Chicago Soldiers South Field, Gurnee's Great America, and Oak Brook Shopping Plaza. Speed events were also held at the following Illinois tracks – O'Hare Stadium, 1/4 mile track, in Schiller Park; Meadowdale Raceway in Carpentersville; and Utica Go-Kart Track. In Wisconsin speed events were held at Wilmot Hills Road Course, now a ski hill, and Lynndale Farms in Pewaukee. In the late 60's and early 70's we didn't store our "Vettes" during winter — we had fun and challenging events on ice!! Lake Geneva had a Winter Festival that had ice-skating and motorcycle racing on the lake. Our club held ice races on the lake during this festival. Corvettes would race around pylons — one car at a time to beat the clock! This event proved very interesting as the ice melted from the heat of the cars. We also did ice racing on Wisconsin's Pell Lake and Twin Lakes. Car shows were held at various Chevrolet dealerships, Gurnee's Great America amusement park, and even in conjunction with a promotion at Lake Geneva's Playboy Club. Many of these facilities no longer exist.

Eighteen CCC members attended the first NCCC convention in Lansing, Michigan, in July of 1962. CCC began running driver training schools for gymkhanas early in its history. On June 7, 1970, CCC sponsored the first Allan Clarke Memorial Time Trials to honor Allan Clarke, one of our members who past away after a



motorcycle accident. The first event was held on the 1/2-mile oval of Illiana Speedway. This yearly event in honor of Allan was held at the following tracks: Blackhawk Farms in Rockton, Illinois; Grundy County Speedway's 1/2 mile track; Rockford Speedway's 1/4 mile NASCAR sanctioned track; Love's Park Go-Cart Track in Rockford, Illinois; and Lake Geneva Raceway.

CCC was the originator of the popular "Corvette Corral" at the Road America Race track in Elkhart Lake, Wisconsin. The "Touch of Glass" Concourse in September of 1975 was another landmark event. Naturally, Corvette fans wanted to see where these cars came to life. CCC was one of the first clubs to tour the original St. Louis assembly plant. This tradition continues, as members tour the assembly plant now located in Bowling Green, Kentucky, as well as the Corvette Museum.

Chicago Corvette Clubs' emphasis has changed throughout the years to the desires of its membership. In 1996 the membership had dropped and the club temporarily faded away. At present, the CCC has roughly 150 members of incredibly diverse backgrounds and interests, all unified by enjoyment of Corvettes. With such diverse interests, our members enjoy a variety of activities, which include an annual picture day at the beginning of "Corvette season," many day or weekend road trips, picnics, and our annual Christmas party. Additionally, the club is active in many area civic activities, community sponsored parades and charity events. For example, CCC has worked with the following charitable organizations: American Red Cross, American Cancer Society, Salvation Army, West Chicago Police Children's Fund, and the Westwood Resource Center. Currently, it is supporting events with the Shriners Hospital in Chicago to benefit disabled children and is

involved with Marklund Children's Home to help raise money for their organization. These activities allow others to experience not only our passion for Corvettes, but also our desire to meet the needs of the community in which we believe.

Certainly, the next 50 years will bring about change in the Chicago Corvette Club. However, it is clear that the last 50 have impacted not only the lives of each of its members, but Corvette history as well.



Other than this, had their roundtable discussion, did cleanup items for the proposed rule book which will be covered later.

They had an appeal hearing last night and at this point in time, the appeal was upheld and he will have a detailed explanation in his minutes.

Mike added this to his report – Thanked all the RCD's that have worked with him the last four years and he wants us to keep in mind what these RCD's do. Everyone has an opinion on something, your RCD's not only have to deal with the two, three, four hundred opinions in your region about our program but then they have to translate that and deal with the other 14 RCD's in the meeting. He appreciates all the work they did and he would like to thank them and all of you for all the cooperation he has received in the last four years.

Roger Mitchell - Immediate Past President

Roger apologized for missing the September meeting, has been quite a while since he has missed a meeting, this will end his current tenure on the E-Board. One of the things he had left in open business to do in September was make the presentation of the keeper to the recipient of the President's award for 2006. We give each year at convention the President's award, traveling trophy it returns to convention in 2007 to be re-awarded and we give that individual who won it in 2006 a token of appreciation on behalf of NCCC that they can keep to add to their collection. This presentation for the President's award for 2006 was awarded to Richard Yanko.

He expressed his appreciation to the executive committee and to those members who have been on it for the last five years that he has been associated with. This organization would not function without the contributions that each of the members in this room make; you guys are the ones who are always here; you go out and find the rest of them to parlay our information to them. We appreciate that; none of the executives or the staff of the Board can do their jobs without your help. He certainly appreciates it; he has a newfound affection for the effort you guys put in. People have asked him if there is anything he has learned from spending five years on the Board and there are many things but if you had to bring it down to one thing that will work and pass it on to your regions and your clubs and all the way down to individual members is that if you want to go fast you can go by yourself, if you want to go far go together. 'You're the best.'

Old Business

Dick updated us on the NCM, nothing much happening since the last meeting. The next Board of Directors meeting will be at the end of the month. They are proceeding with their plans for the two new simulators courtesy of \$250,000 grant from the state of Kentucky plus another \$40,000 they will have to come up with. They are also proceeding with the plans and ground breaking for the new addition, in the process of getting the loans in place for this as well as negotiating on 55 acres of land on the

other side of I65 where they proposing a quarter mile drag strip/road course/parking lot autocross.

Dick presented Roger Mitchell, Hal Bellamy, Carolyn Montgomery, and Mike Godfrey, the outgoing officers with tokens of appreciation for their years of service. Hal donated the money for his gift to the scholarship fund.

Teller committee report given by Patsy Shearer: Ballots were sent out with 239 votes returned and 1 invalid as no signature. She introduced the new officers, VP of Competition – Jack Wilson, Secretary – Cindy Urenda, Sgt. at Arms – Gary Foster, and Business Manger – George Gallant. All the by-laws passed. The convention will be held in Colorado Springs. Dick thanked the teller committee and congratulations to these office holders.

Deb Murphy came up to talk about the proposed budget for 2008. There were no changes made since it was presented to you in September for your consideration. No discussion. Motion made by Allen Morris to accept the budget as presented with a second by Betty Parks. No discussion, budget passed.

Dick then brought up the competition rulebook. As a little background remember last meeting we had it to present in a very draft form that was presented and voted down. Then had a motion passed that we would revisit this rulebook at this meeting and that is what this is about. Larry Hickman had a technical question on page 15 of the bylaws under competition committee, says the competition committee shall review the competition manual and submit their recommendations to the Board of Governors for their approval on the first regularly scheduled business meeting following the annual meeting. That was done; the vote was against the rulebook so how can we vote on it again until next year in September? How can we supercede the bylaw in terms of that vote?

Dave Heinemann responded by stating in front of the competition manual there is a paragraph that tells you what the manual is about and the time length of when it will be in force. Currently the competition rulebook is in force from 2004-2007. Keep in mind, the rulebook is a standing rule, and a standing rule can be changed at any time. What we have done in the past, there was a standing rule put in front of this rulebook and presented with the package as a standing rule that we would not discuss items on this at every meeting, and on this front page of this rulebook it states changes can be made for betterment of the rulebook and would take effect the following year, such changes can only be made by the National Competition Committee with the approval of the Board of Governors. Then he went into the standing rules under competition, #3 and read, once a competition rulebook has been approved by the Board of Governors, the VP of Competition will publish an accumulative listing of all approved rulebook clarification in each issue of Blue Bars until the competition rulebook is revised. So far we have dealt with two standing rule issues and keep in mind, the entire document is a standing rule. Now there is a by-law that Larry just read to us off of page 15 under competition committee. Dave re-read this entire section but reinforced the section that says "any recommendations for changes to the competition rulebook must be submitted to the Competition committee through the Regional Competition Director. Any changes approved by the Board of Governors shall become effective on the first day of the year following approval". We are not through the first day of the year. The book was presented and we discussed this at the meeting in September. A lot of work was put in this rulebook and a lot of RCD's spent four years trying to get these rules betterment for us. Let's keep focused that not when we are going to vote and approve this but lets vote on the content. Let's make a logical and intelligent

decision, it was not ready in September and a lot of work has been put into this. It is a standing rule and what was done to make it clean and it was voted on and accepted by this assembly here that we would postpone that vote to allow every governor and member a chance to review these changes and then do an educated vote at this meeting. A motion had been made on the floor at that time to postpone until this meeting. It is suppose to be presented at the first meeting after the annual meeting and it was presented but you can not make an intelligent decision until you have the ability to see it and what we did was to allow every governor and every member to get a look at this and make a valued decision. That is what we are trying to do at this meeting. The by-law was met by being presented at the first meeting after the annual meeting. That is how he interprets this; let's keep focused on what we are looking at, not when it was presented. Further discussion and clarification of the motion made in September that was withdrawn, and then a final motion made was to postpone the vote until this meeting. Dave read from the September minutes, page 12, last paragraph, and page 13, first paragraph, that outlined in detail what had been discussed.

Dick commented at this time if you had talked to your RCD in September they would have said they did the best to get it to you and they thought it was good. They have had a chance to go back and look at it, have done a lot of massaging and talking amongst themselves and he thinks if you talked to them today your RCD would say they are in agreement with what we have here and we should carry this forward. These folks have put a lot of time and effort on this program.

Chuck Heretta asked for clarification- are we talking about a bylaw which we can not change only once a year or are we talking standing rule. Is the voting done by bylaw or done by standing rule? If done by bylaw, then the motion Kevin made in September is incorrect. If we are voting by standing rule, and he does not see any place where we vote by standing rule, then yes we can continue. Dave commented that first off we are voting on the rulebook package as a standing rule, if it was a bylaw it would not be done at this meeting, it would have gone out in the mailing. No bylaws are voted on; they are presented then mailed out for voting.

Jerry Limpach commented that our rulebook does not cover what to do if the vote fails. There is nothing in the rulebook to tell us what to do if it fails. The common knowledge, which is in error, is that the old rulebook carries over, it does not. As of this point we have no competition program for 2008. This might be something to look at next year to putting something in to cover this situation. Dave stated that if this does fail, we could make a standing rule motion to run on the rulebook for another year.

No further comments, Dick asked for a motion to accept the new rulebook as written for the next four years. Manny Montgomery made and read the following motion; the proposed rulebook dated 2008-2011 as corrected by the RCD committee last night be approved for the competition of NCCC beginning 1 January 2008 for a minimum of one year. This motion was seconded by Howard Curtis. Dick asked for discussion. Jack Wilson of the Midwest region commented, he has been RCD for the past five years and part of the operation of the current rulebook and development of the new rulebook. They have listened to the governors, the participants and the members of the organization to try and develop a rulebook that was streamlined to a point to make it better understood by the members. The end product is agreed to by all of the RCD's and they feel they have done the best they can to fulfill their obligations. He would recommend this rulebook be passed and respectfully submits his recommendations for this rulebook and he would like to ask all the RCD's that support this to stand up.

Further discussion on this by Chuck Heretta who commented that if you listen to what the motion said that was put on the floor just now, it says corrected rulebook. Have any of you seen that corrected rulebook? NO, we are back to the same situation we were in September; you are asking us to vote on something that we have not seen. Dick responded to this by saying as a governor of a club one of the duties of the governor is to elect an RCD, RMD and RE to represent that region. It is the belief that these elected officers for each region will do what is in the best interest not only of the National Council but of their region also. You all sat in this room and watched as each one of your RCD's stood up with the recommendation that you pass this. They are not in here to try and pull wool over your eyes, they believe that what they have to vote on is the best they can do right now. If you don't believe what they are telling you then you have elected the wrong people.

Mike commented what they did was some corrections to spelling, punctuation, indents, numbers in the wrong order. The only things they added were clarifications that were already made and still in effect since the previous rulebook was published. What they wanted to do was to ensure those clarifications were in there, that's what the majority of the changes are. There was one other change where there was a misprinting on the points; it was just a typo for the Concours. Further discussion, then the question was called by Pete Dawley with a second by Bernyce Molenda. Question was called for. Now voting on the rulebook - All of those opposed to the acceptance of the motion where we will accept this competition rulebook for a time period of one year? 42. Those that were in favor of the rulebook were 139. Motion passes. Rulebook will be published on CD and every primary member will get a copy on CD and will also be put on the website.

Arnie Bailey recommended that the rulebook be corrected in a manner similar to what we did in the past to show what was changed. In the past we had what used to be there in italics and what changes were made to it. Otherwise you would spend a lot of time comparing the two. It would be nice to see what was changed. Mike said this could be done. Pete Dawley made a motion to make sure substantial changes are highlighted in the new rulebook. A second was made by Howard Curtis. Motion passed.

New Business

Dick, at the request of the secretary, asked for a motion to destroy the ballots as we see no use in keeping the ballots. Motion made by George Powell with a second by Arnie Bailey to destroy the ballots. No discussion, motion passed.

Dick read off the names for the newly elected regional officers for 2008 for approval by the governors.

RCD's – Paul Haack, Bob Pattillo, Pete Dawley, Ray Meesseman, Manny Montgomery, Larry Morrison, John Backman, Joe Orrico, Mike Godfrey, Jim Asbury, Don Parks, Jerry Corlesski, Brian Gallagher, Chuck Stephens and Paul Hamersly. Also from the RCD's Manny Montgomery will be the finance committee representative. Motion to accept the RCD's for 2008 made by Denny Luther with second by Joe Scafero. No discussion motion passed.

RMD's – Don Smith, Peggy Stephens, Joe Vasta, Patsy Shearer, Sue Runyan, Sue Puksich, Barb Harris, Ellouise Morrison, Ken Daby, Anne Carkner, Cheryl Surdick, Cliff Harris, Pat Brown, and Diane Bowen. No one has been selected for Northeast. Joe Vasta is on the finance committee. The Duntov committee consists of Barb Harris for one year term beginning January 1, 2008, Anne Carkner for two year term beginning January 1st 2008 and Ken Daby a three year term beginning January 1st 2008. Motion to accept these RMD's for 2008 by

Larry Hickman with a second by Calvin Camp. Change requested to change Don Smith to Debbie Haskell. No discussion, motion passed.

RE's – Margaret Bohannan, Chuck Heretta, Mike Weil, Glenn Hutchinson, Mary Bellamy, William Siebel, Calvin Camp, Richard DeSocio, John Maxwell, Jim Gray, John McGee, Bernyce Molenda, Allen Morris, Jerrry Limpach and Gary Brisbois. Allen Morris is the representative for the finance committee. For the newsletter judges, Jerry Limpach, Calvin Camp and Chuck Heretta. Motion to accept these RE's for 2008 made by Bernyce Molenda with a second by Don Schmitt. No discussion motion passed.

Debbie Lindsey made a comment at this time re the Corvette Market magazine, copies which had been made available at this meeting. This is a new publication that has just come out and there will be a flyer in your membership packet. She met these people at Mid America Funfest, so watch for this in your packet.

Dick asked for a motion to appoint Walt Jenkins as the convention director for 2009. Motion made by Calvin Camp with a second by Larry Hickman. No discussion motion passed.

At the last meeting Dick had mentioned that he would be looking for a motion today to give the clubs that have not turned in proxies for the meetings for this year, a chance to get these copies to their RE and submitted to the secretary by November 30, of this year. We did this last year and the year before and it is a good idea because sometimes our RE's and our governors just miss each other in getting these proxies in. This will be for attendance purposes only. Motion made by Arnie Bailey with a second by Calvin Camp. No discussion, motion passed.

Dick Runyan, Governor from Corvette Club of Indiana, as the council is getting in dire needs of funds to keep operating as we are operating now, made a motion to modify the first two sentences of standing rule 9 under financial matters be modified as follows: "The dues for NCCC are set at \$40.00 for new members, \$30.00 for renewals and \$15.00 for spouse/companion and dependents. The dues are set as of 3/1/2008. This motion was seconded by Cliff Harris of Pacific Coast Corvettes. Dick Yanko read this motion again as submitted. This was then opened on the floor for discussion. Dave clarified this does have to lie on the table until the next meeting for a vote as a by-law. Frank Wiethorn expressed concern as he does not see any numbers to support this increase. He referenced the budget for new members for 2006, \$106,000 income and 2005 we had \$97,000 income. This year we are going to \$77.000, why are our new members down? He does not think we have the figures to support the dues increase, he thinks we need the actuals for 2007 plus with the transition from one treasurer to another both doing business a different way he does not think it is going to shake out. Deb Murphy commented that she and Jay did membership dues exactly the same, same numbers, same way they are entered so she is not sure why the comment about the treasurers doing things differently. She also commented that they have been provided the actuals in the minutes. The new membership has been going down; the budget is the best guess as to what we think we are going to spend. We have a lot of expenses that we have no control over, such as gas and postage. We can stack membership #'s in order to balance this budget but if that is not realistic with what we are doing every year it does not make sense to put those numbers in there.

Dick Yanko commented this will lie on the table until the February meeting so we will have the opportunity to see what the 2007 actuals are. Frank commented that some did not know the actuals were included in the minutes, you had to check the tab under the excel sheet to review. Manny Montgomery of the Florida Region commented that he understands we need a dues increase and he can support this for his

region but not in March, He feels it would be better to start September 1st when we start next years renewals and new members would be a better date. Plus we need to stop spending so much money in NCCC; we need to reduce the number of people on the Board.

Roger Mitchell of Southwest Region commented, since we are going to have a meeting to think about this and Frank points out that for at least the last four years we actually have ended up in the black each of those four years, we can't budget that, because there is people like John McGee that walk in here and drop \$34,000 on you. You have know way of knowing, there are items in the budget like that that you can not predict. What Deb is trying to do is to say we anticipate this much income, we anticipate this much expense, and that comes out to the number. Now, if you have a good year, and you watch what you do you wind up better off. That was the pledge we made to you five years ago when we had a dues increase. He told us at the time when this became necessary that it had been 16 yrs previous to this when NCCC had a dues increase and we only did primary, did not do spouses. In this day and age we are not going to be able to go 16 years between

Larry Hickman pointed out that the current P&L that was passed out shows through November not including this meeting \$303,000 total expense for the year, You are projecting \$476,000 in expense for next year, that gives you about \$173,000, there are some questions here, does not know where it is at, but there are questions. Dick Yanko mentioned this motion will lie on the table until the February meeting.

Elaine Heretta, governor of Corvette Cleveland asked why it takes so long to get the patches. She received patches today from 2006 competition year. She received the ones for the Regional champion club at the governors meeting in October. Her members want to know why they have to wait so long to get them. There is nothing special about these that they have to be customed ordered and take until October the following competition year to get them. Why can't we have these at the February National governor's meeting? Mike commented that points all have to be verified, cannot get it done that quickly, these have to be ordered and it takes generally 5-6 weeks to get them. The reason that that particular batch was late was because the people that made them put the wrong year on them. He had to have these redone. Per Dave these normally come in May but there was a problem this year.

No other new business.

50/50 Raffle was \$178.00 to the winner, Dick Runyan.

Dick Yanko made an announcement that he and Gail will be getting married February 9th 2008 in Las Vegas. Congratulations to you both!

Motion to adjourn was made by Larry Hickman and seconded by Arnie Bailey. Meeting adjourned at 4:25pm.

From the Editor...

The minutes found in this issue may be an abridged version of the actual minutes that were distributed by the NCCC Secretary. Please contact your Club Governor or Regional Executive for a complete set of these minutes.

KORVETTE KORNER

This is the first in what is planned to be a series of articles about the car we all love. In each issue, we'll examine a different facet of the Corvette. There's no better place to start the series than the new LS3 engine.

Holy jumpin' horses, Batman! The Corvette engineers did it again. They keep shoehorning more and more horses into the engine compartment of the coupes and convertibles. Who knew they had all that extra room under the hood!

In 2008, at the heart of the coupes and convertibles is the new LS3 engine, a 6.2L V-8 that comes as standard equipment. The small block LS3 features a cast aluminum cylinder block with cast iron cylinder liners. With standard exhaust, it delivers 430 hp at 5900 RPM and generates 424 lb.-ft. of torque at 4600 RPM. The stroke remains at 3.62 inches so the increased displacement is created by punching out the cylinders by .06 inch to 4.06 inches creating 376 cubes. The block casting also features revisions and machining in the bulkheads that enhance its strength and improved bay-to-bay breathing.

The increased displacement is fed by high-flow LS7-style heads, an updated camshaft and camshaft timing, a high-flow intake manifold to improve air intake, and larger pistons.

The cylinder heads are also cast aluminum. Aspiration is accomplished by high-flow cylinder heads serviced by the large port and large valve design found on the LS7. The design employs a larger capacity, straighter intake port which provides better air flow. Breathing is enhanced with larger intake and exhaust valves. The intake valves have lightweight, hollow stems. Their size was bumped nearly nine percent from 2.00 inches to 2.16 inches. The large exhaust valves are 1.60 inches in diameter. The lightweight valves, coupled with new, larger pistons, enable the engine to redline at 6600 RPM.

Although the cam provides the same exhaust lift as the LS2, the cam's intake lift has increased by more than five percent, from .521 to .551 inch. The cam timing has been optimized for the greater lift on the intake side. The updated valve train employs rocker arms that are offset by 6 mm between the valve tip and the pushrod to provide more direct intake port flow.

Gas is fed by high-flow LS7 fuel injectors. With a compression ratio of 10.7:1, premium gas is recommended, but it is not required!

Since the heads and valve train have been updated to provide more air to the cylinders, the intake manifold has been acoustically tuned to improve the flow.

You can add a couple of additional ponies by opting for the twomode exhaust system. It's similar in design and function to the Z06 exhaust system, but not the same as the Z06 exhaust. While the Z06 uses a 3.00 inch exhaust, the exhaust servicing the LS3 is only 2.50 inches. The similarity is in the use of vacuum actuated valves. The valves reduce engine noise during low-load operation and open for maximum performance under high loads. The improved breathing boosts the output of the LS3 to 436 horses and 428 lb.-ft. of torque. The increased horses raise the top end to 190 mph and a 0-60 time of 4.3 seconds. As a by-product, under load, it delivers the growl that says "move over, here I come!"

Students practice their skills on a closed course in specially designated areas of a parking lot. Not only do the students learn critical driving skills, they have a blast. Parents enjoy the sessions as much as, if not more than, the students do. The East Region strongly believes in the driver education initiated by Northern Virginia and adopted a resolution to expand the classes around the region. If we can save just one life through this education, the program will be worthwhile!



If this happens and NCCC finds out about it, NCCC will regard that club as "not in good standing" which will jeopardize the NCCC members' insurance coverage. The members of a club who are not in NCCC should think again about becoming a member. If something happens and you are found in the wrong (and you are sued) it will come out of your pocket if you are not an NCCC member. By being an NCCC member you are covered. Most people and clubs think that if the club is an NCCC club then EVERYONE is covered; this is NOT SO!!!!! If the club is in good standing either by being a 100% or at least a 51% club, then the members who are NCCC members will be covered.

Our Florida region of NCCC is in good shape with the

51% rule so not to worry, BUT if your club isn't maintaining the 51% rule please get up to date with your membership so no one is put in a bad situation when it comes down to crunch time.

What Does It Take to be an Eagle One Award Winner?

Since our club won the award in January of this year, I have had many people ask me what our club did to win such a prestigious award. I also have been asked to print the answer in Blue Bars. I felt the best person to answer this question was the gentleman who worked so hard to fill out the required paperwork , our Vice President, Wayne Martin. The following, in his words, is what he submitted as accomplishments of the Cedar Rapids Corvette Club in relation to its charity and civics work.

"The Cedar Rapids Corvette Club, located in Cedar Rapids, Iowa is actively involved from year to year in community service. The club has five local charities in eastern Iowa that it supports annually. Funds for the different charities are raised primarily through a yearly charity car show, held in June. Homecoming parades are held in the fall for high schools in the area. Funds from the parades are also presented to an additional local charity.

"We have a large charity car show in June each year. The car show proceeds were distributed equally this year to five charities; Clothe-A-Child, Iowa Braille and Sight Saving School, Eastern Iowa Brain Injury Association, Make-A-Wish Foundation, and Miracles in Motion.

"One of the charities that the CRCC has supported since 1977 is the Iowa Braille and Sight Saving School. In May of each year the club sponsors a car rally at the school in Vinton, Iowa. The rally takes place over a 35-mile route with one student riding in each Vette. A luncheon is held afterwards, with awards and trophies given to each student. One student, Troy Buffum, has kept in touch with Di Neal, a CRCC member. Since 1995, when Troy was 15 years old and took his first ride in a Corvette, he has stayed in touch via e-mail, and he fondly remembers the CRCC and the exciting rally rides he took in Di Neal's Corvette.

"In October, at a monthly meeting, the club presents checks from the funds raised at the charity car show to its five charities. The club also participates in a charity event sponsored by Clothe-A-Child in Cedar Rapids. The event is held at Lindale Mall and invites over 300 elementary/middle school children. They go shopping with members of the CRCC and other adults from contributing organizations in the area, to buy needed clothes and shoes. C-A-C uses the check the CRCC presented to assist with the cost of items for approximately 15 of the children. This year, 13 club members took the children on their shopping spree. It is a real joy to see the smiles on the faces of the children as they choose the clothes and shoes they need. This event is a true "heart warmer" for club members, and is enjoyed by all, especially the children.

"Also in October, the CRCC finishes the homecoming parades for the high schools that began in September. The club receives donations from each school per each corvette furnished. The members use their own Vettes and volunteer their time to do these fun parades. The funds raised from the homecoming parades total over \$1,100 a year. Ninety percent of that total is donated to Camp Courageous of Iowa, a camp for special needs children to enjoy during the summer and fall months. CRCC also tries to set up visits to assisted living and seniors facilities in the area. One such visit to Keystone Place, with 14 Vettes, in July, was an opportunity to have a picnic dinner and take drives in the Vettes with the seniors. About 15 members had a great time with the people at Keystone Place; the food, fellowship, and "fast" rides were enjoyed by all.

"In September of 2001 the Cedar Rapids Corvette club was presented the Governor's award by Iowa's Governor Villsak for outstanding community service.

"In January 2007, CRCC earned another distinguished honor. The honor was for outstanding community service in 2006. Eagle One from California presented the club with its "Golden Rule" Mid-west award. The Cedar Rapids Corvette Club competed with approx. 30 other Vette clubs in the Mid-west. The award consisted of a trophy and \$750.00, which was distributed to the club's charities. The accomplishments and activities of CRCC are numerous and provide fun opportunities for members and the community in which it serves. The club takes great pride in its efforts and in its involved membership."
