

FREE STATE CORVETTE CLUB 25 YEARS OF CORVETTE WEEKEND

The Free State Corvette Club of Catonsville, Maryland celebrated its 25th anniversary of Corvette Weekend in October 2011. Since its humble beginnings in 1986, the event has grown to hosting over 1200 participants and



has allowed the club to donate over \$600,000 to charity. That's right, the Free State Corvette Club has donated over six hundred thousand dollars to charity from the proceeds from Corvette Weekend. Every year, the 15th largest NCCC club in the country and the 5th largest Corvette Club in the Eastern Region, hosts Corvette Weekend in Ocean City, MD. Corvette owners come from all over the east coast (from Florida to Connecticut, and even Canada) to spend a weekend in mid-October with fellow Corvette enthusiasts.

The weekend starts out on Friday when most of the participants arrive in Ocean City. The day is filled with a steady stream of Corvettes of all generations visiting the host hotel, once again, the Clarion Fontainebleau.

Visitors are greeted by the cheerful welcoming committee who direct them to the appropriate registration desk. After registration, guests can stop by the official Corvette Weekend apparel department and pick up their pre-ordered apparel or buy right on the spot. The next stop is a wonderful variety of vendors with everything from t-shirts to gold jewelry. Corvettes then head over to the teching lot to have their cars inspected. The day is capped off with our legendary Friday Night Welcoming Party also held at the host hotel, with dinner, drinks, dancing, and give-a-ways galore.



Saturday starts out at the Ocean City Inlet parking lot. The first events of the day are the car shows. Cars of all generations are proudly displayed, and multiple NCCC-sanctioned shows take place simultaneously. There are



also many vendors set up in the inlet that can be patronized after checking out the great cars on display. Next, are the car rallyes. Multiple car rallyes are run concurrently and all are NCCCsanctioned. Poker, Scrabble and Gimmick rallyes are sure to be an adventure for all participants. NCCC points are earned for both the car show and rallye participants. After the shows and rallyes are over, the cars stage in the Inlet Parking lot for the crown jewel event of Corvette Weekend – the legendary Boardwalk Parade.

Hundreds of Corvettes parade up the Ocean City boardwalk to the cheers of thousands of spectators lining the parade route. Corvette Weekend wraps up with the Saturday night awards ceremony. Held at the host hotel, participants can have dinner and drinks followed by the presentation of the day's show and rally winners.

The Free State Corvette Club is proud of the success of 25 years of hosting Corvette Weekend. The generosity of the participants has benefited many Maryland charities, including the Spina Bifida Association of Maryland, the USO at Baltimore Washington International and the Therapeutic Riding Academy of Maryland. OUR ROUTE 66 TRIP

Marjory and I celebrated our 45th wedding anniversary in June of this year by driving our 2004 Corvette convertible all eight states from Chicago to California on old Route 66. This two-week trip was one of the more memorable vacations we have ever taken (and a check off the old "bucket list"). This was the first time we have ever taken a trip with no real daily destination – just drive until you want to stop for the day. We had a map book, entitled "EZ 66 Guide" that was just excellent at keeping us on what remained of the old route.

Driving Route 66 thru Missouri was the prettiest and best labeled. Most parts were like driving thru a tree-lined park. All the old ruins were just left standing as they were when abandoned. Oklahoma was able to keep us on the old route the entire width of the state. Arizona was the worst – putting us up on I-40 at least 150 miles of the state. All of the other states did put us on the Interstate when the old road was no longer there, but most did this for only 30-60 miles each state. BUT—old Route 66 just beat us to death! It is far from a smooth road and run flat tires didn't make the ride any smoother.

Because the road was so rough, I think we drove the entire width of Oklahoma at 45 MPH, but then we were in NO hurry anyway. We averaged 28.8 MPG for the entire 4,435 miles, but that was probably because we never were driving very fast. We did drive with the top down until the temperature hit 107 one day – people look at you like you're NUTS! It finally hit 116 degrees that particular day. With the air conditioner at full force, we never really felt hot until we got back to the humidity of the mid-west corn and soy bean fields.

From central Missouri west, most all of the ruins were still standing, just abandoned. Central Missouri east to Chicago, the ruins were basically gone and something new built on the site. It's just amazing to drive thru these old towns and see a dozen old abandoned hotels and gas stations in what was, at one time, a bustling town. Western Arizona was interesting as we drove from Kingman to Oatman thru a mountainous desert area that had probably 50, 10-15 MPH switchbacks on the way to Needles, CA. (Marjory was not a "happy camper" with the lack of guard rails on her side of the car!)

Some of the more memorable sites were the 4,000 foot long "pony" bridge in Oklahoma where a scene from the movie "Grapes of Wrath" was filmed, "Standing On A Corner in Winslow Arizona;" the meteor crater west of Winslow; Cadillac and Bug ranches in Texas; Tom Stafford museum in Weatherford, OK; Needles, CA; Route 66 Museum in Elk City, OK; Wigwam Motel in AZ; Oatman, AZ with its wild burros; and all of the old ruins and murals. So many of the towns had murals painted on their businesses – faded but still very visible.

The photo below was taken at the Marsh Curve Bridge in KS. Kansas only had 13 miles of Route 66 – not 13 miles remaining – 13 miles total just across its lower southeast corner. The other photo below was taken at a restored Sinclair gas station in Paris Springs Junction, MO. The older gentleman who owned/operated this site was a "talker." We learned a lot of Route 66 history from him plus it took us an hour to get away from him! "Kewl" guy, though!

We did take two side trips. One was to Phoenix, AZ to visit Marjory's old brother where we spent our anniversary by going to a dinner theater to see "Grease," which was very well done. The other side trip was to the Grand Canyon where we had never been before.

We met a lot of very interesting local people on this trip and some amazed foreign visitors. One particular couple from London, England flew into Chicago, rented an RV and were driving Route 66 to California. They said they were lost most the time, but were still having the time of their life! One statement they made amused me. They said they knew the United States was large, but they really had no idea HOW LARGE it was until driving it.

Every Corvette owner NEEDS to do this trip – we had a blast!

The Colorado Springs Corvette Club, Inc. is one of the oldest Corvette clubs in the western United States. In 1962, Daniels Motors was instrumental in organizing the Club. Al Daniels and son, Bill, participated in Club events, local races and the famous Pikes Peak Hill Climb. This year, Club members celebrate the Daniels' initiative and support for the ever-expanding membership and their enthusiasm for Corvettes. The four-generation Daniels family continued their club sponsorship with great-granddaughter Elizabeth Daniels and Daniels Chevyland through 2009. 

LAP OF KENTUCKY 10/16-20/12

We left on the 13th, stopping for some Club cruiser points along the way in Arkansas, Tennessee and Mississippi before arriving on the 15th in Bowling Green, KY. The morning of the 16th all participants met at the NCM and were introduced to our leader, Sgt. Craig Sutton, driving a red C6 and the Museum's representative, Karen Renfrow.



After a few instructions, all 27 cars took off for Dale Hollow Lake State Park where we took a short boat ride to Trooper Island. This is a non-profit camp run by the Kentucky State Troopers for underprivileged kids aged 10-12. After lunch, we drove the winding roads through trees with leaves of yellow, orange, red and purple. We arrived at Cumberland Falls State Park and Lodge in Corbin.

Our first morning there, we took off to Stearns to ride on the Big South Fork Scenic Railroad with a stop at the Blue Heron coal mining camp that operated from 1937-1962. A coal tipple that separated the different types of coal, along with a very high bridge that transported the coal, were a few of the interesting things to see. Back at the train station, we got back in



our Vettes and drove to the Bartell Coal Mining Camp where we learned all about the life of the coal miner.

Our second morning, we left for Chevrolet, KY, just to see the sign and then on to the Benham Schoolhouse Inn, built in 1926. All the coal camp children attended school there. It's a unique Bed and Breakfast now and walking down the locker-filled halls brought back some old school memories. After lunch we visited the KY Coal Mine Museum across the street; then we headed to Pine Mountain State Resort Park & Lodge to spend the night. This was a nice resort with beautiful views. We were so close to Virginia we took off for more Club cruiser points. The next morning, we left and stopped at the McHarguets Mill where cornmeal is still ground with millstones using the power of water to run the grinder. Around the corner was the Mountain Life Museum at the Levi Jackson Wilderness Road State Park in London. We were greeted by a mother and her two daughters dressed in period clothing and were entertained and transported back to the 1800's where we learned how things were back in those days.

Next stop was Corbin for lunch at the Harlan Sanders Museum and Café, otherwise known as Kentucky Fried Chicken. Then on to Berea for our last night at Boone Tavern, an historic inn named for Daniel Boone. After dinner and some Kentucky spoon bread, we all caravanned to Renfro Valley for the "Tribute to Legends" show. Even if you're not a fan of country music, this was a great show with some great performers and music.

We left for home the following morning having met some wonderful fellow Corvette people. Taking the long way home, we stopped to see the Louisville Slugger Museum and Factory. We then drove through Indiana and Illinois and spent the night in St. Louis. After a few more picture stops, we arrived back home.

It was a whirlwind trip but an enjoyable one. You can't go wrong driving your Corvette while seeing all our country has to offer.

NCCC Scholarship Program

The NCCC Scholarship program is funded through donations from Clubs, individuals and corporate friends, such as **Mid America Motorworks**. The NCCC Scholarship Committee awards \$1,000.00 scholarships to worthy young people who have some connection with NCCC through a Father, Mother, Grandfather, Grandmother, etc., who has been a member of NCCC for at least three years. "Some connection" implies that the Applicant's relatives should have knowledge of the various requirements of the Scholarship Program. If the relative is not the Applicant's parent, the relative must write a letter to be included with the completed application indicating the following:

His/Her relationship to the applicant His/Her NCCC Member Number That He/She will be the Applicant's Sponsor That He/She has been closely involved with NCCC for a period of three or more years.

All scholarship applications must be completed correctly and mailed to:

NCCC Scholarship Committee 9741 Sunny Pointe Drive Laingsburg, MI 48848

All applications must be received at the above address no later than the deadline date for the year. The deadline changes from year to year depending upon the date of the Annual NCCC Convention. The 2013 **<u>Received</u>** Deadline Date is April 27, 2013.

PLEASE NOTE: The deadline date is not a mailing date but a date in which the completed application must be received. Applicants submitting forms after the deadline date will be asked to have their application considered for the following year. This delay for late applications has been in effect for a number of years.

Scholarship Application Forms may be obtained at the Governors' Meetings. The Forms are also available on the NCCC website. Be sure to **copy all of the forms** as they are all necessary for application.

Form No. 1 ~ <u>NCCC Requirements/Rules for Scholarship</u> ~ This Form should be used as a Guideline to be sure all of the requirements are met.

Form No. $2 \sim \underline{NCCC Scholarship Application Form} \sim This is$ the four-page application that will need to be filled out in its entirety.

Form No. 3 ~ Letter of Recommendation for NCCC Scholarship Form ~ Be sure to print 3 copies of this form. This NCCC Form is to accompany each of the three required letters of recommendation.

PLEASE MAKE NOTE OF THE FOLLOWING:

1. The applicant should complete all items that are asked for and, in particular, the items regarding the applicant's high school performance even though the applicant may be in college or elsewhere at the time. Item (g) of the Requirements/Rules of the Scholarship reads: (g) three Letters of Recommendation from persons WHO ARE QUALIFIED TO EVALUATE the applicant's potential. The applicant should select three from his/her teachers, principals, academic advisors or similar persons who KNOW of the applicant's academic record and potential.

2.

Note of Explanation: A person completing a Letter of Recommendation for NCCC Scholarship Form should not be a Relative, Government Official, NCCC Friend, Family Friend, Current/Past Employer, etc. UNLESS they also have the qualifications to complete the part of the Letter of Recommendation Form asking them to "rate the applicant on each characteristic in comparison with other students at the same level." The only persons qualified to properly and honestly answer the questions about the Applicant's academic capability are High School or College Teachers/Advisors/Academicians who have evaluated the Applicant regarding the Applicant's enrollment and participation in one or more of their classes. Thus, the only VALID person to complete the Letter of Recommendation for NCCC Scholarship Form is such a Teacher/Academician. The awarding of an NCCC Scholarship is to be based upon the prospects of success based on the academic capability of the Applicant.

3. All items, (a) through (g), of the Requirements/Rules of the Scholarship must be satisfied for any application to be considered. The applicant will be notified by phone of an incomplete application. If not made completed by the deadline, it will be discarded.

The NCCC Scholarship Program has been in existence since 1990.

Pat and Patsy will then peruse the newsletters they receive for articles of interest for *Blue Bars*. Articles and photos are always

needed. Your submissions and input are vital to the success of *Blue Bars*.

All photos in *Blue Bars* should be hi-resolution. The front and back cover photos MUST be hi-resolution in order to retain their 'crisp, clear' quality. The FRONT COVER should fit an 8-1/2" wide x 11" long area (portrait style). 



NCCC Conventions 2013 and 2014

Many of us had a great time there in 2001 and the 2013 Convention sounds like it will be a winner. Now, if we can get into the factory and see the C7's, that would be the frosting on the cake.

Convention in 2014 will be held in Savannah, GA and the early news sounds like this convention will be very unique. You do not want to miss these events. Convention not only provides a great venue to meet NCCC members from around the country, it also provides an opportunity to see and enjoy parts of the country that you might not have had an opportunity to visit.

Midwest Region Championship Series and Fund Raiser

Unfortunately, the Midwest Region Championship Series was not held in 2012 and the Governors and others within the Region are working on revamping the series or making decisions about its future. In September, the Governors approved a number of Regional Standing Rule updates. Most of these were needed to bring our rules up-todate regarding how business is currently conducted. More of such updates will be completed in the coming months, so be watching the MW Region website for them. One addition was the implementation of an Annual Financial Income and Expense plan. While financial planning was always completed within the Region, this new Standing Rule formalizes the process for creating, approving and updating the regions financial plan for the year. I want to thank Nancy Bailey for her efforts on preparing a draft and for working with me to allow this important





process to be presented to the Governors and approved.

Electronic Voting System

The Governors will be using the new NCCC electronic voting system starting in the fall of 2012. It is a very effective system and allows for elimination of paper ballots, mailing and postage expenses, as well as speeding up the entire process and reducing the amount of manual labor involved. I will also be looking at the system for potential use within the Region for the same benefits and will bring a recommendation to the Governors for consideration.

<u>Epilog</u>

We have lost a number of members this year within the Region and across NCCC. It is sad to say that as the organization ages such news is bound to occur more frequently. Therefore, enjoy the time together and rekindle old friendships where maybe they have faded. I shared a Words of Wisdom quote in my last article that still holds true today – "We need old friends to help us grow old and new friends to help us stay young." Get everything out of the organization that you can. Be selfish about this and you find that it will not only make your Corvette experience more enjoyable, you will bring that joy to others. That is what NCCC is all about.



Over the long, hot summer, the Southeast Region continued its growth spurt to reach 1,292 members within our 17 clubs. The top three clubs in membership size are East Tennessee CC (263 members), Nashville CC (262 members) and Corvette Cruisers of Atlanta (97 members).

Competition has been at an all-time record pace. With the help of our clubs donating their sanctions, we have 133 events sanctioned for 2012 - 56 of those events have been slated as Regional fundraisers, taking special advantage of the 21 events for Memorial Day and Labor Day weekends.

The success of the fundraising effort is evident with the purchase of new regional timing equipment to replace the aging system that Corvette Atlanta had so graciously provided for use at the Region's events. The new system includes a TAG timer, wireless transmitter & responders (for timing eyes) and a timing display. This system is compatible with the primary timing equipment being utilized in the Florida and Carolina Regions, so there are back-up capabilities available should there be a last-minute issue with the equipment.

The timing equipment worked quite well in its debut Labor Day weekend. The only issue that we encountered was during the rain. With quick engineering from Capt. Jack (EO-TTCC), the problem was solved with his donation of "rain totes" that fit over the timing eyes. The Davenports (VCV) agreed to transport them in their trailer, so we should be set for the next time it rains while we're running!

As this article goes to print (in November) – please remember we still have plenty of events on the books -- November 3-4 (14 low speeds in Huntsville, AL), November 17-18 (14 low speeds in Nashville, TN at a new venue – Nashville Fairgrounds), November 23-25 (four high speeds in conjunction with six high speeds from Florida Region at Roebling Road Raceway near Savannah, GA), and finally December 1-2 (14 low speeds in Huntsville, AL). Check the calendar on the web for the latest events and flyers.

We do want to thank the clubs again that donated their unused sanctions to help promote participation within the Region. A special thanks goes to East Tennessee CC for helping to locate the facility that we've been able to use for the Regional fundraisers, as well as working & participating in the event. Hope we can see more regional folks attending the Region's events in the future.
