Congratulations to Betty Parks and Larry Lichtenwald on being our 2012 National Champions!



It would be great to see more women out competing. Maybe it would help get attendance at events up again. The point is not only the competition, it is the social part too. Come on out and try it!







Mahoning Valley Corvettes

The Mahoning Valley Corvettes celebrated its 50th year by having a group photo taken at the Youngstown Air Force Reserve Station in Vienna, Ohio with the 910th Airlift Wing, Colonel Reinhard Schmidt, Air Wing Commander. The photos were taken on the "flight line" on August 18, 2012 in front of one of the C-130 Cargo planes based there.

50 years ago on September 7, 1961 six Corvette owners met at a home in Vienna, Ohio to discuss the possibilities of forming a club. A club was formed and named the Mahoning Valley Corvettes. The club was incorporated under the state laws of Ohio on January 1, 1962 with five charter members. The Mahoning Valley Corvettes held its first official meeting on January 6, 1962 at the Youngstown Municipal Airport in Vienna, Ohio with the purported purpose of "encouraging interest in Corvettes, and to promote driving safety and good driving habits." The Mahoning Valley Corvettes later joined the NCCC in 1969.

The MVCC is a very active club, hosting great social events such as cruises, a weekly car show at the Boardman Quaker Steak and Lube. Our premier event is our NCCC sanctioned car show, which is held at Greenwood Chevrolet in Austintown, Ohio in July, which most of the proceeds go to various needy families in the Mahoning Valley.



Vegas Vettes & the Silver State Classic Challenge



While most Corvette Clubs are familiar with and/or participated in




an SCCA (Sports Car Club of America)

driving event there is one driving event that the Las Vegas Corvettes

Association, aka Vegas Vettes, has been participating in for the past 15 years. This event is the Silver State Classic Challenge (SSCC) open road race, which is held twice a year on a 90-mile stretch of public highway, Nevada State



Route 318 from Lund to Hiko, Nevada.



Silver State Classic Challenge, Inc, a non-profit corporation, has been putting on the races since 1988 and this September's SSCC will be the 25th anniversary event. This is going to be a milestone event, not just because it is the 25th running, but because during the NORC on May 20, 2012 the 12-year old world record was broken. Joe Peruto, driving a 2006 NASCAR chassis, Dodge Charger averaged 217.557 MPH for the 90-mile course in the Unlimited Category. Can you imagine covering 90 miles on a public highway in 25 minutes? Additionally, the State of Nevada has decided to name Highway 318, the Silver State Classic Challenge Highway.

The goal is to average as close to your selected miles per hour as possible. The cars are run in classes at five mile per hour increments to 150 mph, then 10 MPH separation to the 180 MPH class. The class is determined by the vehicles



safety equipment, the driver's experience and the driver/navigator comfort level. There is also an Unlimited Division, where the goal is to go as fast as possible, for very experienced drivers, over 21 years of age, with full race-equipped cars. Vehicles are started at one minute intervals, beginning with the 150 mph class and working down to the 95 mph class. Once the last 95 mph class vehicle clears the course, the Unlimited Division and the higher speed brackets over 150 MPH, at five or more minute intervals, are run as the final group.

Since the very beginning, Corvettes have been the most popular car to run in the events. Any where from 28 to 77 Corvettes per event have done either the NORC or SSCC. In 2000 a 1984 Corvette set the record with an average speed of 201.96 MPH. Corvettes have participated in all speed divisions, from 95 to 180 MPH plus the Unlimited Division. There is also the Team Challenge competitions, where teams are formed that have between seven and ten cars. Some teams are formed up in Ely during registration or at the car show, while some teams are from car clubs. Vegas Vettes usually has two teams and in the past race one team was from Canada.

While a couple of members had run in early SSCCs, large scale Vegas Vettes participation began in 1997 when a 1984 Corvette was race



prepared by several members, and entered along with three other Vegas Vettes members cars. Besides running in the 1997 SSCC race, then



Club president Larry Duis became club chairman for the SSCC events and thus started the association with SSCC that continues to this day.

Over the years, the

SSCC has grown, from the single driving event on Sunday to a 4-day event starting in Las Vegas on Thursday with tech inspections, a driving school for first timers, a press luncheon, followed by a

cocktail party up in Ely, Nevada. Ely, a small Nevada town of 4255 folks becomes the center of SSCC activities for the next three days. Two additional driving events, the half-mile and one-mile shootouts



are held on a 1.9 mile portion of Nevada Highway 490 on Friday and Saturday respectively. A parade of all race cars through downtown Ely is held on Friday afternoon. You'll see some of the race cars have guest riders –



young children from Ely. After the parade there is a welcome party in the Ely Community Center. On Saturday morning there is a car show



of all the race cars in the City Park with the winners selected by a group of Ely residents. Tech inspections are also conducted in the City Park on Saturday.

As you can imagine, it

takes a lot of people, mostly volunteers, and resources to put on these two events each year. Securing a 90-mile section of highway that goes through three Nevada counties requires many course workers, communications and emergency personnel and equipment. Every access to Highway 318 must be secured and every portion of the highway must be in sight of a course worker who can relay information via radio to emergency personnel. Marshalling cars for the shootouts and car show; administrative duties; and most importantly, car safety inspections just before the events near the starting line are all done by volunteers.

In 1997, in addition to participating in the SSCC driving events, the Las Vegas Corvettes Association began volunteering to assist in race operations, running the Saturday car show and added safety enhancements. Ten



years ago, after a club member's car ran off the highway due to a tire failure, LVCA stepped up and began performing cockpit and tire safety checks just before the starting line. For the cockpit check, one person on either side of the car opens the doors and checks for and removes any



loose articles and makes sure the driver's and navigator's safety belts and helmet straps are adjusted properly. After the cockpit check, the car moves forward to where four members perform the tire check. With one inspector at each wheel, the car is slowly moved forward one complete tire rotation. Additionally the inspectors look for any problems underneath the car, such as leaking fluids or a loose part. If nails or screws are found, and result in a leak when pulled out, it eliminates the entry - you do not want a tire failure at 100+ MPH. After the tire check, the car moves up to the starting line where they leave, in one minute intervals.

Racers are competing against the clock – attempting to cross the finish line with an average speed that exactly matches the entrants speed class. You've got to be close. For example, the winning entry in the 145 MPH class this May, finished the race with an average speed of 144.9995 MPH, 6th place's average was 144.9768 MPH!

During this May's NORC there were nine Vegas Vettes cars in the race and 24 volunteers in Ely for the Thursday through Sunday events. Of the 108 entries, 39 were Corvettes. Out of the 11 classes, from 100 to 170 MPH, in which there were Corvettes competing, Corvettes took 20 of the 33 possible top 3 awards, five of the 20 were

Vegas Vettes. The 130 MPH class consisted entirely of Corvettes! Although the half-mile shootout was won by a Lamborghini and followed by a couple of Vipers, the highest speed for a Corvette in this event was 149.3 MPH.



The one-mile shootout was won by a Viper followed by the record breaking Charger, but in 3rd place was a 2010 Corvette at 164.7 MPH. The fastest Corvette in the 90-mile open road rally was a 2002 Z06 with an average speed of 174.3143 MPH!


Carlisle Concours Corvette Show History by Stu Jones



The York County Corvette Club (YCCC) was founded in 1968. During the 1970's it became a member of the NCCC. Chip and Judy Miller joined our club in the early 1970's. Both were active members and held numerous offices including President. While living in York they built a house which included a garage which would hold 13 of Chip's cars. He was car crazy from an early age.

By the 1970's, anyone interested in restoring or showing 1950's or 1960's era cars

had few options. There was a belief that the only cars deemed worthy to collect were pre-WWII automobiles. The largest local car venue @ Hershey did not include post war cars. By the mid-1970's, Chip Miller and Bill Miller, Jr. had become friends through their love of cars and realized there was an obvious need for recognition of post war cars. They started renting and subsequently purchased the Carlisle Fair Grounds. On September 26, 1974, on the rented Carlisle Fairgrounds, "Post War '74" took place. It was the very first car event promoted by the two Miller's. In a year still remembered for gas lines and inflation, nearly 600 vendors set up in more than 800 spaces, and 13,000 spectators paid the \$1 admission to sample their wares.



The first Corvette Show found in our records is a "Clean 'n Shine Concours for Corvettes, October 3, 1976. YCCC assisted with running this annual Concours Corvette show. In 1982, the show became the NCCC Concours showfield within Corvettes @ Carlisle and CVCC and CPCC joined with us to work the show. Subsequently, YCCC has administrated this NCCC show for a couple decades.

The early passing of Chip Miller affected us all and a portion of the proceeds from all of YCCC shows is passed on the Chip Miller Foundation, which seeks a cure for Amyloidosis.

In the early days, YCCC members set up tents adjacent to the show field. this was a convenient location for running the show and taking care of their cars. As the event expanded, there was not much room for camping on the grounds.

For those of you who may not have attended this event before, and there must be a few, at least beyond the east coast and eastern Canada, this is one of the premier Corvette events in the United States. Corvettes @ Carlisle draws visitors from all over the world. Central PA is a great place to spend a weekend. Gettysburg and the Amish Country and Washington, DC are a few nearby attractions. This event should be on every Corvette lovers must attend list.



The NCCC show is limited to the 1st 175 entrants. Registration gives you entrance to the grounds for three days and parking on the NCCC show field. There are wash and show, street and show, custom, modified, race prepared, and concours events for C1's thru C7's with trophies for class winners and cash prizes Best of Show, Best of Concours Prepared, Best Modified, Best Street Prepared, Best Wash & Show, and Best Custom/Race Prepared.

NCCC Scholarship Program

The NCCC Scholarship program is funded through donations from Clubs, individuals and corporate friends, such as **Mid America Motorworks**. The NCCC Scholarship Committee awards \$1,000.00 scholarships to worthy young people who have some connection with NCCC through a Father, Mother, Grandfather, Grandmother, etc., who has been a member of NCCC for at least three years. "Some connection" implies that the Applicant's relatives should have knowledge of the various requirements of the Scholarship Program. If the relative is not the Applicant's parent, the relative must write a letter to be included with the completed application indicating the following:

His/Her relationship to the applicant
His/Her NCCC Member Number
That He/She will be the Applicant's Sponsor
That He/She has been closely involved with NCCC for a period of three or more years.

All scholarship applications must be completed correctly and mailed to:

All application must be received at the above address no later than the deadline date for the year. The deadline changes from year to year depending upon the date of the Annual NCCC Convention. The 2013 **Received Deadline Date** is April 27, 2013.

PLEASE NOTE: The deadline date is not a mailing date but a date in which the completed application must be received. Applicants submitting forms after the deadline date will be asked to have their application considered for the following year. This delay for late applications has been in effect for a number of years.

Scholarship Application Forms may be obtained at the Governors' Meetings. The Forms are also available on the NCCC website. Be sure to **copy all of the forms** as they are all necessary for application.

Form No. 1 \sim NCCC Requirements/Rules for Scholarship \sim This Form should be used as a Guideline to be sure all of the requirements are met.

Form No. 2 ~ NCCC Scholarship Application Form ~ This is the four-page application that will need to be filled out in its entirety.

Form No. 3 ~ <u>Letter of Recommendation for NCCC</u> <u>Scholarship Form</u> ~ Be sure to print 3 copies of this form. This NCCC Form is to accompany each of the three required letters of recommendation.

PLEASE MAKE NOTE OF THE FOLLOWING:


1. The applicant should complete all items that are asked for and, in particular, the items regarding the applicant's high school performance even though the applicant may be in college or elsewhere at the time.

2. Item (g) of the Requirements/Rules of the Scholarship reads:
(g) three Letters of Recommendation from persons WHO ARE
QUALIFIED TO EVALUATE the applicant's potential. The
applicant should select three from his/her teachers, principals,
academic advisors or similar persons who KNOW of the applicant's
academic record and potential.

Note of Explanation: A person completing a Letter of Recommendation for NCCC Scholarship Form should not be a Relative, Government Official, NCCC Friend, Family Friend, Current/Past Employer, etc. UNLESS they also have the qualifications to complete the part of the Letter of Recommendation Form asking them to "rate the applicant on each characteristic in comparison with other students at the same level." The only persons qualified to properly and honestly answer the questions about the Applicant's academic capability are High School or College Teachers/Advisors/Academicians who have evaluated the Applicant regarding the Applicant's enrollment and participation in one or more of their classes. Thus, the only VALID person to complete the Letter of Recommendation for NCCC Scholarship Form is such a Teacher/Academician. The awarding of an NCCC Scholarship is to be based upon the prospects of success based on the academic capability of the Applicant.

3. All items, (a) through (g), of the Requirements/Rules of the Scholarship must be satisfied for any application to be considered. The applicant will be notified by phone of an incomplete application. If not made completed by the deadline, it will be discarded.

The NCCC Scholarship Program has been in existence since 1990.

From the VP Membership

All of our clubs, from smallest to largest, make up the Corvette Family and that is what makes us unique among car enthusiast clubs. Whether it's a cruise-in that brings together Corvette friends to a local restaurant or the large weekend extravaganzas, we always know that we are among friends. At the beginning of March 2013, our membership is approaching almost 17,000.

An idea I shared at our recent national governor's meeting is what I like to call a "10-10-10 Plan." By this I mean that our clubs, depending on the size of current membership, could recruit ten new members who will join their club; actively have ten additional members in the process of showing interest in becoming members but are "not quite there"; and, to retain at least ten members we'd like to call our "Legacy members", those who have been long-time members and who may have lost a little interest in our club and regional activities. Some clubs may end up adding far more members than the "10" and that would be great. Some smaller clubs might almost be there in achieving the "10". But the interesting thing about the "10-10-10 Plan" is that we have 265 clubs. If we come close to bringing in and retaining those new members and legacy members, we will certainly be enroute to a new burst of membership numbers in NCCC.

We hope that many of our members are making plans for the 2013 Convention in Bowling Green from June 24 to June 28. Lots of activities and events will keep everyone very busy as we gather at the Home of the Corvette. The Southeast Region is working very hard to ensure that everything will be perfect and that we will have the experience of attending one of the best Conventions. I look forward to seeing a lot of friends from all across the country in Bowling Green and I'll probably even be seeing the results of the speed events with their names above mine. But that is okay, we are all part of the big Corvette Family.

From the Director of Public Relations



The New Year has kicked off for Corvette with a big bang; not only as Corvette's 60th Anniversary year. It also started with the 2014 C7 Corvette reveal, which was held on 1-13-13 – an invitation-only event at a private location in Chicago, IL. NCCC was represented at the event by Hal Bellamy (as our President and NCM Board

Member), along with Paul Haack (VP Competition) and his wife Diane. They provided me with numerous photos from the two-day reveal event, which was turned into a slideshow that was playing during the National Governor's February Meeting.



We would like to re-iterate that NCCC, your regions and/or your clubs <u>DO NOT</u> have authority from GM to utilize the new C7 Corvette logo and/or the new Stingray logo for any purpose at this time. Sponsorship is working with GM to obtain the approval for NCCC to use these new logos in the future. At this time, NCCC only has approval to utilize the C1 thru C6 logos for use on our club's not-for-profit needs for print, newsletters, etc.

Our public relations activities will continue heavy among several areas again this year; not just with the promotional display use. We are working ads with clubs, with dealerships, large events, etc. utilizing multiple forms of media. NCCC does need more visibility out there, especially at the larger events and in numerous Corvette publications; do you know a publication or event we should be at? If so, contact me.

PR Offerings: promoting NCCC isn't just one person's job within NCCC, it belongs to all of us. It starts with leveraging the many tools you have available to you, not only the displays but other options we offer.



•If your sponsoring dealership is willing to provide a promotional handout to new Corvette owners, please contact me so we can work together to promote the dealership, your club and NCCC. I am offering my

time to create the joint flyer for this use; the printing cost is up to you and the dealership to work out. This is just one more way that we can show the benefits of your club and NCCC; with, hopefully, fewer new Corvette owners heading towards non-NCCC clubs or no club at all.

David Goebel of the *East Tennessee Corvette Club* was the first to take me up on this offer; their dealership is now providing the joint brochure to every new Corvette Owner. There is a sample of this on the NCCC website; see the PR page.

Is there a fairly large Corvette event in your area in which NCCC doesn't have a promotional presence? While NCCC's two promotional displays are good mediums to utilize at



your events, they may not be the best tool for every event. As we have been working with some potential new clubs and smaller events, we are starting to see a need for sending only the promotional materials; some also utilized only the DVD. Not only is this more economical for NCCC, but it also allows us to focus the information for your club's individual situations. Think about some of the times you have utilized the promotional displays and what might make them better, or what might have even worked better than the display itself – I would like to hear about it.

The "Why NCCC" documents have been updated and are available for you to use for your club's needs. You will now find two versions of each document; one is the "print version" that is setup for printing at your local copy shop (bi-fold). The other version (by popular request) is a "presentation / readable version" that enables you to link, use it in your newsletter, email it to your members, etc. Again, all of these can be found on our national website, located on the Public Relations and the Membership pages.

We would invite you to also use these documents, especially the promo flyer, within your clubs and regions. We have found it useful within our club to distribute promo flyers at our membership meetings and especially at the new member orientations. The PR page has these linked, which will allow you to print them for any of your needs. As an NCCC member, you are part of the NCCC promotional team because it isn't just the responsibility of Public Relations, a National or Regional officer, nor even just the Club Governor's job; it is something that every NCCC member should be actively doing all the time. The truth is that most people join our Corvette clubs because we are a Corvette Club, not because we are NCCC. So, unless you help to promote the benefits, most will never know the real benefits of why our clubs are affiliated with NCCC and why we should remain members.

Social Media: Facebook & Linked-In will continue to be utilized to promote NCCC around the world. We do utilize a separate page to promote each Convention, which is focusing on 2013 at the current time. This allows us to post periodic reminders and news splashes around Convention and the events being planned. If you see a post on Facebook or Linked-In for NCCC, we would invite you to help in the public relations efforts by simply "liking" and/or commenting on the



event. Each new like and comment keeps our visibility higher to everyone around the world.

Current ADs and Event Promotions: We are continuing ADs in several of the large publications, such as NCRS, NCM, Carlisle, Funfest, etc. However, we are always looking for new and other advertising opportunities. If you have one that you feel would be a potential benefit to NCCC, contact me. The ADs for this year have a distant and different look; trying to keep them fresh, modern, new and appealing to potential members. Promotional Displays & Care Packages: The displays are offered on a first-come basis. There are only a limited number of units, so make your reservation early or they will already be booked for the date you need.



- The two large Promotional Displays are the full units that sit on a tabletop, complete with a DVD and promotional materials. These units are expensive to ship out, so please request and fully utilize them when they are shipped out.
- We have one new Promotional Banner Display that was on display at the February National Governors' Meeting; its focus is ONLY for INDOOR events. The display contents (still being assembled) will consist of the vertical banner and promotional materials only; no table display, DVD player, etc. This display is perfect for your indoor club car show display where you don't have room for the larger table display.
- We also offer "Care Packages" for events

that only contain promotional materials for events where you cannot use either of the displays mentioned above. These are relatively inexpensive to ship out and it saves our organization money to not send the displays when they won't be used.

Public Relations will continue to look to you to be our eyes, ears and salesperson in search of new markets, of events and opportunities to promote and grow NCCC. I welcome the opportunity to partner with you to help your club, your region and NCCC at these events. It might even need to be a visit to your region to talk and promote NCCC to the clubs that do not attend National Meetings. If so, contact me.

In closing, please remember that NCCC is <u>YOUR organization</u> and finding solutions to grow and benefit membership must be of high importance to all of us. There is no single individual or single group that can do this alone, so let's put our heads together and make it happen. If you have constructive ideas or opportunities around how to better our NCCC organization, please feel free to contact the Vision Committee, the eBoard or me directly.

We hope that you and your club have a fun, healthy, safe and prosperous 2013; and, regardless what your Corvette passion is, continue to get out and ENJOY "America's Sports Car"!

REMINDER to Governors and Newsletter Editors...

Please arrange for hardcopies of your club's newsletters to be mailed to PAT CLARK (Michiana CC) at 50866 Country Knolls Drive, Granger, IN 46530. Electronic copies of club newsletters should be emailed to PATSY SHEARER (CKCC) at wsbearer001@cfl.rr.com. Pat and Patsy will then peruse the newsletters they receive for articles of interest for Blue Bars. Articles and photos are always needed. Your submissions and input are vital to the success of Blue Bars.

All photos in *Blue Bars* should be hi-resolution. The front and back cover photos MUST be hi-resolution in order to retain their 'crisp, clear' quality. The FRONT COVER should fit an 8-1/2" wide x 11" long area (portrait style). Because of the current layout of the front cover with the blue bars at the top and bottom of the page, the actual focus of the photo should fit in an 8-1/2" wide x 7-1/4" long area (in the center of the page).

The BACK COVER photo has no obstructions like the front cover; therefore, the back cover photo should be landscape style and fit 8-1/2" wide x 6" long. All front and back cover photos must be in full color.

Remember, change is good for everyone...even NCCC members. However, when it comes to NCCC members changing addresses, it is very important that ALL members keep your mailing addresses up-to-date

in the NCCC membership database at all times, because the NCCC membership database generates the <u>mailing list</u> for each issue *Blue Bars*. Governors, please remind your club members of the following deadlines for <u>updating the NCCC membership database</u> with their address changes prior to printing and distributing each issue of *Blue Bars*:

June 21, 2013 (for the Summer 2013 issue)


More recently, NCCC members may have met Don and Janet at the NCCC Conventions in Colorado Springs, CO, and Tinley Park, IL.

Around the turn of the millennium, the East Region of NCCC developed an automated system for maintaining the competition standings, replacing the paper and pencil systems that previously existed. The system was integrated to the membership database so member names and NCCC numbers were maintained in sync. It was an advanced system at the time it was developed. However, it was based

on batch inputs. Results had to be entered into a spreadsheet, and then the spreadsheet was transferred into other software to update points. Finally, the results were transferred to a PDF, which was posted on the web page. The system developed for the East Region did not match the requirements of the national



competition system, so the Regional Competition Director (RCD) had to modify the inputs for the East Region reporting to the same format required by the national system, requiring significant work by the RCD. As good as this was when it was developed, it did not take advantage of current technology.

During 2010 and 2011, Walt Jenkins developed an online application to support the membership database processing for the national organization. With this foundation in place, he developed a competition application (app) in 2012 that provided most of the functionality of the previous system, but took advantage of current technology. Now, events can be entered online by the event chair. When the chair completes the entry, an e-mail is sent to the club governor to approve the event. After the governor approves the event, an e-mail is sent to the RCD requesting his approval, and so on. The results of the event can be entered by the event chair at the conclusion of the event followed by similar hierarchical approvals. In theory (and if all approvals are made through Wi-Fi, it is theoretically possible to have the results of an event posted by the time the entrant gets home! Cumulative points are updated and available to members as soon as results are entered and approved. Your governor received training on the new competition app at the March regional meeting. The links to the new app are on the East Region web site (www.ernccc.org). If you have any questions about the new app, please contact your club governor.

Time is running out to register for the 2013 NCCC Convention in Bowling Green, KY. The Convention starts on Monday this year, so people will have to take less time off from work to attend the full convention program. In addition to the Convention activities, this is also a good time to make a pilgrimage to the National Corvette Museum. The GM Plant will be shut down to prepare for the manufacturing of the C7 model. However, a special static tour is available at extra cost through the Museum. (Check the NCM web site if it is not already sold out.)

In the East Region, we are embarking on a program to get youngsters more involved in Corvette activities. This has at least two significant benefits. First, it will permit them to understand the enthusiasm we have for events centered on the vehicle. Second, and arguably more important, it fosters the ability to have more family events. It seems that kids grow up much faster than we would like them to. We can remember the day they were born as if it were yesterday and it seems like they begin making their own way in the world tomorrow. This year, we would like to build more family memories between these two dates by involving our children and grandchildren in more East Region events. Watch the East Region web site for more family events.

Debbie Lindsey, Director of Sponsorship, will again make her annual trek to Corvettes of Carlisle this year to sell tickets for the raffle car for the National Kidney Foundation (NKF). Last year, members from the Bel Air, Lancaster County and Revolution Corvette Clubs assisted Debbie in selling tickets. I again thank them for their assistance. Please contact me if you would like to help Debbie this year. A large number of volunteers will reduce the load for everyone.

Region News

Electronic Age Growing Fast Within the Region

I reported last time that our Governors used the new NCCC electronic voting system for national Officer elections and rule changes last year. NCCC agreed to fund an upgrade of the system for regional use and our Governors tested the system over the winter with good success. We had 17 of the 31 club Governors test the system. At our February meeting, the Governors agreed to begin using the system within the region. We will be establishing procedures for its use not only for regional officer elections, eliminating paper ballots, and associated mailing expenses, but also to gather information on a variety of topics where club input is essential. This can be a huge benefit for clubs whose Governors cannot easily attend regional Governors meetings. I would hope that all club Governors would participate in using the system to help guide and direct the region.

Epilog

At each National Governors meeting members who have passed on are honored with a moment of silence. The list seems to grow longer with each meeting and at the February meeting our region list was the largest read. I share this not to be a downer but a reality-check. As we start the 2013 Corvette season we should ensure that we do not miss an opportunity to cherish each other's company. Paul Haack chaired the February National Governors meeting due to Hal Bellamy's absence and Paul made a comment that vividly supports my closing thoughts to you. He stated, "We join NCCC for the car and we stay in NCCC for the people." As we start the season, remember those who are no longer with us and use their memory as a reminder to enjoy every encounter that you have with NCCC members wherever we gather. That is what it is all about.

Competition News

I am writing this Spring article while it is snowing outside, and I am looking forward to the upcoming competition season. Additional Autocross events in Rantoul during July and our October Fundraiser will bring the total events to 205. A Workers program will reward those non-competitors who come out to help run events and chairpersons for the first time in the region. Competition and Worker awards will be presented at our March Awards Banquet. For 2012, 53 Men and 29 Ladies received awards, and the top five clubs were recognized. Congratulations to Dale and Carolyn Samuelson – 2012 Men's and Ladies Champions; and Windy City Corvettes – 2012 Club Champions.

Competition Database

The new Competition database has been a challenge in its first year, but all events have been entered. Once members become familiar with it, tracking and looking up event information will be much easier. The error checking and mileage calculations should make event results more consistent and accurate. Mileage will now be calculated by postal code from an entrant's residence to the event site.

Revised Standard Operating Procedures

As a region, we must continue to move forward with the changing times. In reviewing our SOP's there were rules that were inconsistent with the way we currently operate. Approved changes include setting the head tax at the Sanctioning meeting for the following year, closing the sanctioning period December 15th instead of January 15th, renaming the Permanent Number program to the Assigned number program and reducing the requested competition number charge of \$10 per event to \$10 per day for Region Members. New rules defining our Workers program were defined.

Ellouise Morrison has served the Rocky Mountain Region as the RMD for 13 and ½ years. It seems appropriate to say a few words recognizing her accomplishments.

Ellouise was asked by Sue Crumb, the Region's RE at the time, to take over the RMD position in July 1998 after Randy Neilson had resigned. She was then elected at the next regional election and held the RMD position through 2012 when she retired. During this time period, she only missed one (1) National Governors' Meeting and that was due to her husband's illness.






