Fall 2013 issue...August 31...published in late-October Winter 2014 issue...November 30...published in late-January Spring 2014 issue...February 28...published in late April Summer 2014 issue...May 31...published in late July

Articles with photos for front or back cover placement are treated differently.

- You send me an article in Word format and/or photo via email or snailmail.

- Upon receipt of your article and/or photo, I will add your article and/or photo to my chronological list according to the date I receive them.

- When your article and/or photo reaches the top of my chronological list, they will appear in the next issue of *Blue Bars*.

Blue Bars is limited to four (4) front covers and four (4) back covers each year. Numerous clubs want to appear on the front or back cover to celebrate an anniversary, special club event, etc.; however, I am unable to accommodate all clubs in a timely manner. If your club is willing to wait for cover placement, the move up the list is slower and the waiting time is longer. However, depending on space availability in each issue of *Blue Bars*, I will be happy to accommodate as many articles and/or photos as I can INSIDE each issue, resulting in a shorter waiting time on the chronological list.

Whether you wish to have cover or inside placement, I cannot guarantee in which issue your article and/or photo will appear.

<u>All photos in *Blue Bars* should be hi-resolution</u>. The front and back cover photos MUST be hi-resolution in order to retain their 'crisp, clear' quality.

The FRONT COVER should fit an 8-1/2" wide x 11" long area (portrait style). Because of the current layout of the front cover with the blue bars at the top and bottom of the page, the actual focus of the photo should fit in an 8-1/2" wide x 7-1/4" long area (in the center of the page).

The BACK COVER photo has no obstructions like the front cover; therefore, the back cover photo should be landscape style and fit 8-1/2" wide x 6" long.

All front and back cover photos must be in full color.

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Beachcomber's Corvette Club Sound of Freedom x 43

On a crisp Friday morning in September, the normal sound of freedom associated with the Navy jets flying around Naval Air Station Oceana in Virginia Beach, VA was augmented by the addition of a number of stunt pilots, civilian flight demonstration teams, the Navy's Blue Angels and the roar of America's Sports Car. The Beachcomber's Corvette Club of Virginia Beach, VA provided 37 pristine examples of one of America's crowning achievements, the Corvette, to the din of roaring jet engines and helicopter rotors.



The membership of the Beachcomber's, coming from one the country's largest regional concentrations of military bases, is quite naturally comprised of a number of active and retired military members representing all five branches of the armed forces. A number of our Navy members began coordinating with NAS Oceana officials and the Blue Angels themselves to see if we could set up a photo opportunity while the Blue's were in town for the annual air show. It all came together on Friday September 14th, the first day of the air show.

At 8 AM, the parking lot of the NAS Oceana Exchange (shopping mall) complex started to fill up with Corvettes of all colors proudly representing all six generations. By 9 AM, there were 37 Corvettes awaiting escort onto the base



for the photo op. One might suspect that, as early morning shoppers arrived at the Exchange, their curiosity would compel them to do a walk by of the impromptu collection of American horsepower. This audience, being used to the "Need for Speed" as Tom Cruise once said, were still awed by this display of raw horsepower and beauty and were interested in our purpose for being there. Once informed that we were there for a photo op with the Blues, they quickly said "how lucky" and then proceeded on their way. Even the one sailor in his Boss 302 Mustang, who made a noisy pass as he revved his engine, came back to tell us how good we looked.

At 10 AM, base security arrived to provide escort onto the base for the photo session. The looks of the bystanders as 37 Corvettes rolled past the gate and through the base were interesting to watch. None of us were quite sure how they had it set up, but our escort led us directly through an access gate to the operational flight line and then all the way down to the air show announcer's booth where five of the six Blue Angel jets were parked neatly in a row (the 6th was being readied for the show in the maintenance area).







We quickly parked our cars in formation (it was a military base after all) in front of the Blues and begin taking as many pictures as we could. The entire album can be viewed on our webpage at <u>www.beachcomberscorvetteclub.com</u> . Since 9/11, to get this close to actual military aircraft without individual escort is extremely unusual. We were both proud and grateful for the opportunity.



The theme of this year's show was a Red, White and Blue celebration of the bicentennial of the War of 1812. In keeping with the patriotic theme, we chose three cars--red,



white and blue, of course, to form a V for victory in the front of our formation. Our hosts, the NAS Oceana Event Coordinator and the Public Affairs representative from the Blues, both remarked about how quickly we organized, staged and presented our club once on the flight line. The military influence might have had something to do with it.

As I wrap up this story, I uncovered some interesting tidbits that made this day even more special. The Blue Angels have been flying since 1946, the same year Zora Arkus-Duntov first tried to qualify a car for the Indianapolis 500. NAS Oceana held its first air show in 1953 as the Corvette was being born. The Beachcomber's are celebrating their 30th year as a club and the Corvette has already begun its 60 year anniversary celebration. All in all, it was a wonderful experience to have the sound of freedom exemplified by the sounds of our fighting forces and the roar of a true symbol of American engineering excellence.

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West Coast Convention April 4-7, 2013



At long last, the first ever regional convention became a reality. What a blast it was. We had 340 registered participants but, of that number, 114 came from outside our Region. Our Regional leadership was in attendance in full force. Allen Morris, Regional Executive; Joe Orrico, Regional Competition Director' Cliff Harris, Regional Membership Director; Ellis Chee, Regional Treasurer; Cindy Orrico, Regional Secretary; and Rex Wihoite of Las Vegas Corvettes Association as the Convention Treasurer helped run and participated in the first ever NCCC West Coast Regional convention.

In addition, several NCCC National officers and directors attended from all over the country. We thank Hal Bellamy, Current NCCC President; Dick Yanko, past president of NCCC, 1999-2002 and 2007-2010; Jerry Britner, past NCCC president 1995-1996; Jay Hommer, past NCCC Treasurer 2001-2005; Roger Mitchell past NCCC President 2003-2006; Cindy Urenda past National Secretary and current Convention Director and George Swift, former National





Public Relations Director.

The sponsors of the event were Kumho Tires, Corvette Mike, GM DownUnder and Findlay Chevrolet. This convention would not have been a success without these sponsors. Kumho Tires sponsored the track events at Spring Mountain in Pahrump. Corvette Mike's covered the Welcoming Party at the Silverton Hotel. GM DownUnder sponsored the awards breakfast on Sunday morning. Findley Chevrolet sponsored the trophies and raffle at the dealership.

The Convention started in earnest on Thursday morning with the Tech Inspection for the races and the rallyes.

After the inspections, the Welcoming party began at the pool deck at the Silverton Hotel.

During the day prior to the Welcoming party, Registration continued at a brisk pace. The team in the Registration / Hospitality suite made everyone welcome.



Friday morning at 6:15 AM, the racers headed out for Spring Mountain Motorsport Park for the autocross and time trials on the 2.4 mile course. Everyone lined up for the Gimmick Rallye on the way to Pahrump. Some competitors, though, just headed out for the race course to make sure that they did not miss the drivers' meeting.

No convention is complete without an Autocross event. That function alone either requires very large registration fees or a very generous sponsor or both. In our case, Kumho Tires did an amazing thing. They provided our convention with funding to rent Spring Mountain Track in Pahrump for both low speed autocross and high speed time trials. They also donated a set of tires for the raffle drawing at the track. The rules were that you had to be present to win and, as luck would have it, the first name drawn, Joanne Maioli, was not present. The second name drawn, John Galchik from Roadrunner Region, Thunder Vette Set, was present and had a smile on his face the rest of the weekend. Kumho Tires needs a big "shout out" from all those who attended for their sponsorship.

The low speed event was hosted by Vettes'R'Us and the high speed event was hosted by Corvette Super Sports. Both clubs paid tribute to Kumho for their sponsorship and for the quality of their tires that were seen an many of the competitors. Most of us who have participated in low speed events in the Region know that when TC McNett is in charge, the event is professionally managed, and a great friend is in charge. All of us appreciate TC, his computer skills, his racing skills and his in-depth knowledge of racing. TC is a great proponent of Kumho Tires as well. The High speed event was run by none other than our very own Joe Orrico. Were it not for Joe Orrico, there would be no high speed events in the Region. His advocacy of the use of transponders to track times and his extensive racing experience made for a great event with two 20 minute run sessions.

Saturday was the day for the Car show and Rallyes. The day started with the Car Show and, immediately after lunch, the Gimmick and Poker Rallyes were started. The Car Show was well attended even though more than half of the cars had been at the track the day before. Those racers who participated on Friday had to be up at dawn to clean their cars. No one thought ahead enough to completely cover their cars with racing tape to make the car show preparation easier. The car show, hosted by our friends at The Vette Set from Carson, showed off our cars and the ones that had raced the day before looked like all the others - show room ready.

The Gimmick Rallye was designed to allow the participants to see the sights and sounds of the Las Vegas area. The Rallye started at the Silverton Hotel and ended at Findlay Chevrolet where we were treated to a warm and friendly staff, snacks and a Raffle Prize distribution. The rallye was put together by Benita Klaizner of the Las Vegas Corvettes Association and a poker rallye hosted by the Pomona Valley Corvette Association.

Sunday was the awards breakfast. The trophies are truly a oneof-a-kind with amazing art work.

We believe that the NCCC West Coast Region Convention was a rousing success and I heard that it is very possible that the West Coast Region will do this again. The participation from around the Region, as well as the participants from so many other regions, made it a great time for all. The venue was great and the weather was perfect.

We also want to thank the NCCC officers who came from as far away as Florida, Iowa, Colorado, Kentucky and Texas and made this event one to remember.

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About the Front Cover



Founded in the spring of 1968, the Central Kansas Corvette Association (CKCA) recently celebrated its 45th anniversary. Eight of the original founding members remain active in the club today. CKCA is believed to be the second oldest Corvette Club in the state of Kansas and members range in age from 40-85 spanning six generations of Corvette production. Based in Hutchinson, KS, CKCA members reside in Dodge City, Wichita, Salina and the Hutchinson vicinity.

Membership had declined to eight members in the summer of 2011 when the Executive Committee was approached by a group of 'youthful' and 'exuberant' local Corvette enthusiasts who had a desire to re-energize and grow the club. A letter was written and mailed to local Corvette enthusiasts in September 2011. Following the letter, an exploratory get acquainted meeting and dinner was held in October with 25 people attending.

The following are excerpts from the introductory letter:

"By receiving this letter you have been identified as a member of a very elite fraternity – Corvette owner. We all know the excitement of getting behind the wheel of our Corvette and just enjoying the drive. The Central Kansas Corvette Association (CKCA) has been promoting the "Corvette Experience" in Hutchinson since 1968. We would like to invite you to attend a meeting of the local Corvette owners in hopes of expanding the membership of the local Corvette club. There is no obligation but, hopefully, this meeting will demonstrate how fun it is to get together with other Corvette owners. Membership activities include drive and dines, car shows, road trips and just getting together with other car people. It is also a great place to get answers to repair questions, network to find parts or possibly find your next Corvette."

The near dormant club grew to over 30 members by the end of 2011. CKCA designed a new CKCA logo during the spring of 2012 and the momentum continued. The group photograph was taken on April 15, 2012 at the Hutchinson, Kansas Airport. 52 members with 32 corvettes attended the club outing. Following the group photograph, CKCA members enjoyed a dinner paid by the club at the Hutchinson Airport Steakhouse. At the time of this writing, membership was at 64. The clubs goal is 75 members by the end of 2013. CKCA claims to be one of the fastest growing corvette clubs in North America.

In the early years, CKCA was very active in autocross. We hosted several regional events at the old Navy Air Base in Hutchinson and also at the Markley Complex in Salina. CKCA has several skilled drivers who have traveled to autocrosses at NCCC conventions and have won many FTD's and national trophies. In the mid-70's, several members even traveled to an autocross at Daytona Raceway hauling their corvette in the back of a farm grain truck while pulling another corvette with a trailer. A photograph later appeared on the cover of a national Corvette magazine that we haven't been able to locate at the time of this writing (Please help us locate the photo... possibly in 'Vette Vues' Magazine). We have a proud racing history and have current members who have attended the Spring Mountain Advanced Driving School.

Currently, the CKCA sponsors an annual spring Corvette and Harley Davidson show benefiting the local Hutchinson Zoo. Meetings are held monthly and drive and dines are scheduled every 4-6 weeks during the spring, summer and fall driving months. The club is planning to caravan to Bowling Green to help celebrate the 20th Anniversary of the National Corvette Museum, August 28-30, 2014. We hope to see you there.

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Corvette Club notes compromise to effects of Ethanol

Put it in, whether car owners like it or not. That's the story behind California's gasoline and how it affects the owners of old cars in adverse ways. This is the point of Doug Prince's comments in the July 2011 edition of The Solid

Scoop, Southern California Chapter, Solid Axle Corvette Club, 9701 Willow Oak Ct., Bakersfield, CA 93311 (Jim Lundal, editor).


He calls current gasolines in California "possibly the worse in decades," and here's why.

He says all gasoline in the state contains at least 10 percent ethanol. This "is a hygroscopic additive which attracts water...and when combined with gasoline forms an acid compound called salitic acid." He then delivers sobering news. "All C1 (Corvette) carburetors and fuel injection units are made from...'pot metal'...a cheap leftover product." Since it is easily die-cast into various forms, old Corvettes used it in parts of carburetors and fuel meter bodies. Letting a car sit with the fuel in its system can result in the salitic acid eating away at those inner parts.

To remedy the matter, he suggests adding half a quart of auto9matic transmission fluid to every full tank of gasoline. While this won't repair existing damage, he notes that it will restrict the possibility of more damage. "I use

Dextron ATF which I purchase at Pep Boys," he notes. Other brands from some major oil refineries should work just as well.

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ABOUT THE BACK COVER



Mid-Coast CC (MCCC) was formed in the summer of 1973 by Ron Stanford after he bought a new 1973 Corvette coupe. Among the early members were Robert Stanford (1936 roadster), Mike Slade (1963 coupe), Jerry Whittset (1966 coupe, 1957 roadster), John Thayer (1969 t-top, 1958 roadster), Joy Maywald (1963 coupe "custom"), Bob Stephenson (1960 roadster) and Wesley Wong (1969 roadster). Long time club member Hayman Dengler joined the club in 1975.

MCCC joined the National Council of Corvette Clubs (NCCC) early in 1976 after a short stint in the Western States Corvette Club. The first NCCC convention the club attended en masse was the 1977 Convention in Dallas, TX. Allan Orr won the NCCC raffle 1976 Pace Car Corvette. In the 1982, NCCC helped the Hou-Tex Corvette Club host the NCCC Convention by working the autocross. The club, with Allan Orr as event chairman, also hosted the Rallye at that Convention. Hayman Dengler held the National Drag Record in class 2B in 1984. MCCC was noted for winning the Annual Southwest Regional Participation Award in the 1980's and not having anyone at the Awards Banquet to pick up the award! MCCC is still a member of NCCC to this day.

MCCC held many Corvette shows in the Brazos Mall in Lake Jackson, TX, in exchange for getting to use the Mall parking lot for autocrossing. In the mid-1980's, the Texas "Blue Laws" were rescinded. This let the Mall open on Sunday, which effectively did away with autocrossing in the parking lot. In about 1988, the club became dormant due to job requirements and the activities of the members' children.


In 1995, MCCC was re-vitalized after a couple of Corvette enthusiasts. Baron Vincent and Gil Rasco connected with some of the early members, Bob Stephenson and Hayman Dengler. The group reviewed the club bylaws and decided to start meeting again. For the next several years, the club stayed busy attracting new members and trying to have a presence in the community. MCCC held several smaller car shows, working on fundraisers and enjoyed club outings along with NCCC events.

The club continues to be active with several charities, especially BACH (Brazoria County Association for Children with Handicaps). The club has its own "brick" at the Corvette Museum, and many members participated in the Corvette's 50th Anniversary celebration in 2003. We co-sponsor an NCCC event each year in Waco, TX, with the Cen-Tex CC, and occasionally hot car shows in the Brazosport area. The club has evolved from its inception, languished for a few years, but has been back in action for the last 17 years. During this time, things have changed, but all members still enjoy the camaraderie associated with Corvettes.

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Fulfilling a Challenge

Dinah Shore a favorite spokesperson for Chevrolet greeted America on Sunday evenings from 1959 until 1963 as she sang "*See the USA in your Chevrolet.*" Nearly a half century later, Doug and LaDonna Slack, of Kalama, Washington brought those words back to life when a long time friend, Bob White who was undergo-

ing cancer treatment, gave them his 1961 Corvette. Nick named "Old Gold" because of its Fawn Beige color scheme and age Bob offered Doug his Corvette with two conditions — that Slack drive the car until it reaches at least 500,000 miles and that he finish White's goal of taking it to all of the lower 48 states. The couple rose to the challenge logging thousands of miles traveling cross country where they saw the sites, visited family members, and celebrated life in honor of their friend.

"Bob bought the car when it was one year old and drove it coast to coast," Doug said.

His friend, who had once been a student of his, was an auto shop teacher in California who won several awards with his students, including a national trophy. Bob drove his Corvette to the GM Training Center for classes and workshops.

Doug said his friend always was proud of the accrued mileage on the car and believed the vehicle would keep going forever with proper maintenance and repairs. Something Doug agrees with 100%. That's why he and LaDonna take every opportunity they have to get "Old Gold" out of the garage and drive it. The car came equipped with a 283 cubic inch V-8 engine. Replacement engines included a 327 engine when the original engine wore out. After that, a 350 tuned port engine from a 1992 Camaro IROC Z28.

"The notion of traveling so much in such a vintage Corvette might make most aficionados shudder," Doug said. "Most collectors will squirrel the car away and delight in keeping it with low miles thinking it will increase its value. I believe it should be driven." He and LaDonna enjoy seeing the looks on youngsters' faces as they drive down the road. "It's amazing how many little kids have their faces pasted up against the window," Doug stated.



"They're looking out and pointing at the car. It's part of Americana. It's an important part of our heritage."

While their blog and photo journals reflect countless recollections of their cross country experience, one event brings back memories of their friend who died shortly after they began their adventure. The Slacks took the car to Independence, Ore., where their Bob's daughter was getting married. The bride happily had photos taken of herself and her new husband in and around the Corvette her father had owned for so many years. "It was such an honor to take part in that," Doug said. To complete the final leg of their challenge, the Slacks drove 8,744 miles in 40 days. A journey that incldued 33 different states to visit 112 friends all over this country. Many were family members and all are friends. They also made a trip into Canada where they wanted to experience the Canadian side of Niagara Falls. On the way, they were able to celebrate three milestone birthdays - Doug's mother's 95th birthday in the Minneapolis area, LaDonna's mother's 90th birthday in western Iowa 50th birthday on the final leg of their coast to coast jaunt. With their trip taking them through the heartland of America, they enjoyed driving the back roads and sharing the highway with farm trucks, tractors pulling grain carts, combines with picker heads attached all driven by farmers who waved hello as they cruised by in "Old Gold." Crisp fall mornings and the warmth of sunshine streaming down on them made the journey seem more like fun than work

Throughout the trip, Doug realized the Fawn Beige color of the car was ideal. He believes it is an expressive color that enhances the shape and style of the vehicle. It really shows off the cove's concave shape and the style line that defines the "Duck Tail" shape of the rear body. On the long road trip, the color did a great job hiding the dried road splash and dirt that built up over the miles.

At the end of their journey, the odometer for their 1961 Corvette read 476,787 after 40 days on the road. They averaged just under 22 MPG for the trip and added only one pint of engine oil. After some vigorous scrubbing, Doug had a couple of rattles and one squeak to fix. For a treat, he decided on a new convertible top and weather strips. For Doug and LaDonna Slack, this great adventure gave them a chance to see the United States from coast to coast while fulfilling the wishes of their departed friend.

At this time, NCCC only has approval to utilize the C1 thru C6 logos for use on our club's not-for-profit needs for print, newsletters, etc.

Public Relations activities continue busily in several areas this year already and not just with the promotional display use. We are working ads for large events (including new venues), with clubs, with their dealerships, etc. utilizing multiple forms of media. We need more visibility out there, especially at the larger events and in numerous Corvette publications; so if you know an event or publication that we should be at, contact me.

PR Offerings: promoting NCCC is a task / job for all of us; and it starts with leveraging the many tools you have available to you, and <u>not just</u> the displays!

- Is there a fairly large Corvette event in your area in which NCCC doesn't have a promotional presence? While NCCC's promotional displays are good mediums to utilize at your events, they may not always be the best tool for every event. We have been seeing a need for sending only the promotional materials to some events while others might only need the NCCC DVD. Not only is this more economical for NCCC, but it also allows us to focus the information for the individual situations. If you have utilized any of the promotional displays or materials, what could have make them better, with more impact, or what might have even worked better than the display itself I would like to hear about it.
- The "*Why NCCC*" documents continue to be available for you to use within your clubs and regions but also to help promote NCCC. Keep one or two with you at all times; you just never know when you will have the opportunity to talk to a

potential member or club where you might need one.

There are two versions of each document. One is the "print version" that is setup for printing at your local copy shop (bi-fold). The other is a "presentation / readable version" that enables you to link, use it in your newsletter, email it to your members, share it with non-NCCC clubs via email, etc. All of these can be found on our NCCC website located on the Public Relations and the Membership pages.

You, as an NCCC member, are part of the NCCC promotional and sales team; because it isn't just the responsibility of public relations, a specific national or regional officer, nor just the Club Governor's job. This should be something that every NCCC member should be doing all the time. The truth is that most of our members join our Corvette Clubs because we are a Corvette Club, not because we are NCCC. So, unless you help to promote the benefits of why your club is a part of NCCC, most will never know the real benefits and, more importantly, why they should remain members.

• If your sponsoring dealership is willing to provide a promotional handout to new Corvette owners, please contact me so we can work together to promote the dealership, your club and NCCC. I am offering my time to create the joint flyer for this use. The printing cost is up to you and the dealership to work out. This is just one more way that we can show the benefits of your club and NCCC and, hopefully, fewer new Corvette owners that head towards non-NCCC clubs or no club at all.

We have heard some positive responses from the East Tennessee Corvette Club with their use of the brochure. You might ask, "Why do we need a brochure for a dealership in a car that was purchased there?" Because they already know about that dealership and sometimes even our club. Think of the times you have purchased a Corvette, how excited you were, how proud you were to show it off. Then when people asked you about it, you told them about the car, where you purchased it, etc. Well, this joint brochure is a tool that a new owner can now pass to that someone who might be interested in buying a Corvette or looking for a Corvette Club. There is a sample of this on the NCCC website. It is located on the PR page.

Social Media: Let's face it - *Facebook* is no longer the dominion of college students and *Twitter* isn't just a celebrity ego-booster. Whether you're a prolific poster or digital dinosaur, there's no denying that social media has become a major part of our lives, both personally and professionally. Did you know that:

- One out of every seven minutes spent online is on *Facebook*?
- Two days' worth of video is uploaded to *YouTube* every



minute?

- 61 percent of *Linked-In* members use it as their primary professional networking site?
- There are more devices connected to the Internet than there are people on this planet?

These are the reasons that *Facebook & Linked-In* will continue to be utilized to promote NCCC around the world. For Facebook, we do utilize a separate page to promote each Convention – which is focusing on 2013 at the current time. This allows us to post periodic reminders and news splashes around Convention and the events being planned. If you see a post on *Facebook* or *Linked-In* for NCCC, we would appreciate your stepping in to assist in our public relations efforts by simply "liking" and/ or commenting on the event post. Each new like and comment keeps NCCC and our Convention visibility higher to everyone around the world.



Current ADs and Event Promotions:

We are continuing ADs in several of the large publications such as NCRS, NCM, Carlisle, Funfest, etc.; however, we are always looking for new and other advertising opportunities. If you have one that you feel would be a potential benefit to NCCC, contact me. The ADs for this year continue the distinct and different look; always trying to keep them fresh, modern, new and appealing to potential

- We are discussing another couple of first-time venues for Ads, as well; one being the Circuit of the Americas (COTA) in Austin, TX and another being the Carmel by the Sea Concours.

Promotional Displays & Care Packages: The displays are offered on a first come basis. There are only a limited number of units, so make your reservation early – or they will already be booked for the date you need.

- The two large Promotional Displays are the full units that sit on a tabletop, complete with a DVD and promotional materials. These units are expensive to ship out, so please request and fully utilize them when they are shipped out.
- Our new Promotional Banner Display has been very busy since the February National Governors' Meeting and, to restate, its focus is for use <u>ONLY for INDOOR</u>



<u>events</u>. The display contents will consist of the vertical banner and promotional materials, a DVD. There is no table display or DVD player. This display is perfect for your indoor club car show display where you don't have room for the larger table display.

- As of writing this article, all three of NCCC's displays are out and being used around the country – so don't hesitate to book one of the units for your event before it is too late. <u>Note</u>: we will not take items from one display to expand another one nor should both be requested for the same event. Each unit has been designed for specific functions and we need each to be available separately.
- We also offer "Care Packages" for events that only contain promotional materials, for events where you can't use either of the displays mentioned above. These are relatively inexpensive to ship out and it saves our organization money to not send the displays when they won't be used.

Public Relations continues to look to each and every one of you

to be our eyes, ears and an NCCC salesperson in search of new markets and for events and opportunities to promote and help grow NCCC. I welcome the opportunity to partner up with you to help your club, your region and NCCC at these events. It might even need to be a visit to your region to talk and promote NCCC to the clubs that don't attend National Meetings. With enough notice, I am available and willing to do so; so please contact me.

In closing, remember that NCCC is <u>YOUR organization</u> and finding solutions to grow and benefit membership should be highly important to all of us. There is no single individual or single group in our organization that can do this alone, so let's put our heads together and make it happen! If you have constructive ideas or opportunities about how to better our NCCC organization, please feel free to contact the Vision Committee, the eBoard or me directly.

We hope that you, your club and your region have a fun, healthy, safe and prosperous 2013 and, regardless what your Corvette passion is, get out and ENJOY "*America's Sports Car*"!



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SUBJECT: FCOA 101

What the heck is this FCOA you keep hearing about??? Sit back, relax and "brush up" on one of my favorite subjects! The only homework assignment that will get you an "A" in this class is submitting a FCOA membership application for your kids, grandkids, nieces and nephews who are under the age of 16. And the only pop quiz question is "Why is there a dolphin in the FCOA logo?" (Hint: Your "cheat sheet" is NCCC's Standing Rules if you don't know the answer!)

<u>LESSON #1</u>: FCOA (FUTURE CORVETTE OWNERS ASSN.) is the youth organization of NCCC. It's a unique "Corvette Club for kids" formed to interest the younger generation in the Corvette hobby. This is the generation that is the Corvette enthusiast of the 21st century! FCOA members are the foundation of NCCC's future and hopefully FCOA members will go on to be active NCCC members when they turn 16.

<u>LESSON #2</u>: Concern for NCCC's future led Southeast Region members Don and Betty Parks to envision a way to involve more kids in the Corvette hobby. In 1991, with this in mind, they led a group of NCCC members to develop a new youth membership concept and FCOA was "born". The first 76 members were signed up at the 1991 NCCC Convention in Charlotte NC. In 1992 FCOA was designated as the "official" junior organization of NCCC. Marleen DeZeeuw was the first "Director" of FCOA. Karen Port took over that volunteer position in 1995, laying groundwork for me to build on when I picked up the reins in 1997.

<u>LESSON #3</u>: The original \$2 FCOA dues cost was increased to \$5 fee in October, 1991 and then to the present one-time \$10 fee in 2011. WOW! No dues increase in 20 years! How was that possible? Since 1997 Mid America Motorworks has been FCOA's main sponsor, providing membership cards and patches as well as helping with postage costs. FCOA "benefits" such as the other items included in the membership packet are supported by other automotive-related businesses as well as some NCCC Regions and Clubs. Fund-raisers for FCOA include selling some Corvette books for kids and a Corvette history coloring book created for the enjoyment of both kids and adults. In 2003 FCOA held a raffle for a 1953 Corvette pedal car, in 2006 FCOA had a raffle for a set of Goodyear tires and in 2012 the Quine family organized a raffle for a set of Kumho tires.

<u>LESSON #4</u> Since 1997, new FCOA members receive a membership packet tailored for different age groups. Included is a personalized welcome letter, FCOA patch, FCOA membership card plus a notepad, dash plaque, stickers, trading cards and other items supplied by those who support the FCOA program. It's not always possible but I try to get enough items so that all current members can receive a packet of "goodies" annually.

<u>LESSON #5</u>: Many FCOA milestones have been reached in the last few years. In 1999 FCOA assigned FCOA membership #1000, in 2002 FCOA #2000, in 2005 FCOA #3000, FCOA #4000 in 2009 and it looks like FCOA #5000 will be assigned in 2013. Assigning membership numbers for FCOA is done a little different than NCCC as numbering is consecutive rather than separated by Region and/or Club. Since 1999 FCOA has "honored" every 100th member in *Blue Bars*, on its website and with some extra things in their new FCOA member welcome packet. In 1998 the Midwest Region was the first Region to attain 100 FCOA members; in 2009 it became the first Region to hit 500 FCOA members. In 2006 the West Region was the second Region to attain over 400 FCOA members. Windy City Corvettes is the first club to sign up over 200 FCOA members and Cedar Rapids Corvette Club is the second club to exceed 100 members.

Things change in NCCC over the years and FCOA is no different. FCOA has its own e-mail address (FCOAkids@aol.com) and its great website (www.corvettesnccc.org/fcoa1.html). In late 2005 a new FCOA logo was introduced along with a line of FCOA apparel for kids. A really fantastic "change" the last few years is that quite a few of the new FCOA members are <u>second</u> generation FCOA kids ~ now how great is that!?!?!? What does that mean? It means that the new member is the son or daughter of a former FCOA member who in many cases is now a NCCC member!

Class is over! Don't miss out on that "A" ~ get those FCOA membership applications in soon! What are you waiting for? Get those kids excited about our favorite car ~ you don't want them running around in a Viper, Porsche or Mustang, do you? THANKS TO ALL YOU NCCC MEMBERS for making FCOA such a successful program for young Corvette enthusiasts! It *is* the foundation of NCCC's 21st century so get those young kids signed up now and then encourage them to join NCCC as a Youth Member when they have their 16th birthday!



The origin of NCCC conventions seems automatic. However, a great deal of planning and effort is required. Typically, regions take on the responsibility for hosting a convention. Three years prior to a convention, regions hoping to host a convention begin attending the Convention Steering Committee (CSC) Meetings at the national governors meeting. Two years prior to a convention, regions



submit a proposal for hosting a convention to the CSC. The CSC provides feedback to the proposing region. Then, a proposal is made to the NCCC Executive Board followed by a vote by all governors in October.

In February, I learned that no region proposed hosting a convention in 2015. I made this announcement in the March regional governors meeting and asked if the East Region was interested in hosting the convention. Dave Walter, the perennial East Region competitor has attended all national conventions since 1973 save two. He felt that NCCC should never permit a year go by without a convention and volunteered to be the East Region point person for 2015. He wasted no time catching up for the late start. To date, there are no other regions bidding for the 2015 convention. If approved by governors in October, the East Region will host this convention. This undertaking requires significant effort so Dave is seeking volunteers to assist in a number of areas including registration, entertainment, tech team, Corvette Mall, Beverage Chair, Competition, security, merchandise, awards, door prizes, decorations, banquet, tours and local sponsorship. If you are interested in assisting Dave, email him at <u>ER-Convention-Lead@ERNCCC.org</u>.

A couple times a year, club members approach me believing they can obtain better and cheaper insurance than provided by NCCC. Or, they say "*We're not a racing club! We only do car shows, parades and social events. Therefore, we do not need NCCC insurance!*" In reality, speed events are typically very controlled to ensure the safety of both participants and spectators. Car shows and parades have a higher chance of liability since the club sponsoring the event cannot exercise the degree of control over spectators since they want to get (too) close to the vehicles. Substances that make cars 'shiney' has a tendency to also be slippery presenting a fall hazard. No reasonable degree of control can prevent a child unexpectedly running into the parade path.

Sometimes litigious events arise from well-intentioned events. A few years ago, a long-time member of an East Region club passed away. At the interment, someone provided the minister a poem to read commemorating the decedent. The widow was so moved by the poem, she asked that it be included in the club newsletter which was published electronically. Shortly thereafter, I received a call from the club governor. He was notified by a law firm that the club Board of Directors and the club was being sued for a significant sum. Unknown to all, the poem was copyrighted and Board of Directors and the club were being sued for copyright infringement. I contacted the NCCC Business Manager who, in turn, contacted the NCCC insurance company. This claim was resolved without cost to the club! Obviously, this event was totally

unforeseen and it is unlikely the club would have even thought to obtain insurance coverage for this!

The West Region Regional Executive informed me of a situation in his region in which a club member crossed the centerline when going to the club president's home after a prom queen parade and killed an occupant of an oncoming car. The club and the Board of Directors were sued for a SUBSTANTIAL SUM. Once again, NCCC insurance handled the claim without cost to the club or board.

Unfortunately, people learn what their insurance policy does not cover at the time the coverage is most needed. As a club member or board member, are you prepared to defend yourself against suits such as these? Are you willing to risk your assets to try to save a couple dollars? In the current litigious environment, anyone can sue anyone. Lawyers always look for *deep pockets* to maximize the fee they can obtain. Frivolous lawsuits against you will likely be dismissed. However, you must still incur the cost of defending yourself. Are my arguments ludicrous? If you think so, would you also believe that a person could win a suit because their coffee was hot?

We have had good success during a couple of early tests. Over 75% of the Governors have used the system for testing and information polls that I presented. This is a higher rate of use then in last years Officer Election when 66% of the Governors returned paper ballots. Given these results, I will be proposing a change to the regions Standing Rules to allow for use of the new Electronic Voting System for our annual Officer elections. This will save the region envelope, photocopy and postage costs and reduce quite a bit of manual labor involved in the current procedure.

I also want to report to you that **Tom Kasten**, Little Egypt CC, working with **Nancy Bailey**, our Regional Treasurer, completed the required audit of the Region's financial records. The audit results proved that the regions finances are properly controlled and reported. So, a huge thank you to Nancy for her continued efforts in this very important region role.

<u>Epilog</u>

This is a great place for me to talk directly with each member of our region. Actually, it is the only forum where I can get information directly to each regional member. I will use this article to ask you to ensure that your Governors are participating in the region activities for your club. Using the new Regional Voting System your Governor has a simple and effective way of letting the region know of your clubs input on topics that are presented as well as use the system to vote for your regional officers (when approved). Your Governor should be using the system to voice your clubs preferences on various topics that affect all of the regions clubs. While final operating decisions are made at the Regional Governors meeting in Saint Louis, there is no longer a reason why each club cannot present their recommendations using e-Polling capabilities. This is an easy way for all clubs to have a voice, not just a few who travel to Saint Louis. Please encourage your Governors to be involved and help set our future direction. Our goal is to have 100% of the clubs participate not just the 75% who have contributed to date.

Club and Member Spotlights

The Bay State CC has been associated with the NCCC since it was founded in 1969, in Holliston, MA. 44 years later it is still going strong. The club is made up of members from throughout New England. The club runs four autocrosses each season and participates in drag racing and road racing events throughout the Northeast and Canada. The club also hosts social activities, including weekend get-a-ways, summer cookouts and fall foliage cruises.

Joe Scafidi, a member of the club since the mid-1980's recently had the honor of having his 1963 Z06 displayed at the Year of the '63 (50th anniversary) NCRS Regional Event at the National Corvette Museum in April of this year.

Here is Joe's story:

This is a 1963 Z06 Small tank coupe, 1 of 199 Z06's made in 1963. There were 63 big tank (36 gal) cars built, the remainder were small tank cars. All Z06 cars came with fuel injection, heavy duty springs and sway bars, along with metallic brakes and giant finned / vented brake drums.

This Z06 was ordered new in the winter of 1962 by a man named Earl (Sandy) Chapman. Sandy was very successful in New England SCCA circles racing a MGB coupe. He wanted to move up into a higher CC class and heard about the Z06 Corvettes winning races so he placed an order for one. This Z06 was delivered to Best Chevrolet in Massachusetts. Due to a growing business and growing family Sandy never got to race the Corvette. It was too tough to drive on the street in race form so he sold it to his mechanic. The car spent all its life in Massachusetts, but was retired from street duty in 1975 by its 4th owner and disassembled for a complete restoration. It is in that condition that I found it in 2009. I have since restored the car and achieved

One region is rumored to conduct all membership processing electronically – WOW!





Perhaps there are other Internet/computer operations that could be applied to our procedures. For example, my club offers our members the option of having the club newsletter physically mailed to the member or offering the newsletter electronically. In addition to the cost savings the club enjoys, some members like the wider availability that the electronic copy offers. 

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Operation Stockings for Soldiers

In November 2011 Mary Wolter, while perusing Facebook, came across an OPERATION STOCKINGS FOR SOLDIERS request from Captain Kevin Humphrey

Mary learned in October 2012 that one of our CCT members has a son, Captain Thomas Grabos, who was recently deployed to Afghanistan as the commander of the

who sent out an all points bulletin. "I am here in Afghanistan and I need help for Christmas. In the darkness of **Christmas Eve** and Christmas day our warriors will still be launching planes. I will be going to every warrior we have and I would like to give them a Christmas



stocking." Mary thought that it would be great if every CCT member would make a Christmas stocking filled with all sorts of items for Christmas for the soldiers in Afghanistan who are putting their lives on the line protecting our freedom and the Afghanistan residents. Members brought 27 stockings stuffed with items to the November CCT membership meeting.

Mary also asked one of the Arlington Grace Lutheran School (GLS) teachers if the students would like to prepare Christmas greeting cards for the soldiers to accompany the Christmas stockings. The response from the students was overwhelming, and they put a lot of thought and creativity in preparing numerous cards. We put each stocking in clear plastic zip-lock bags along with a greeting card, and then we packed all the stockings into five large boxes. After completing the packing, we completed a Customs Declaration form 2976A for each box, then "finally" we transported the boxes to the USPS for shipment to the USAF soldiers stationed in Afghanistan. The total weight of the shipment was 102 lbs. and the cost to ship was approximately \$2.50 per pound.

151st Engineering Company consisting of 96 soldiers in four platoons in Afghanistan. Having coordinated in the Operation Stockings for Soldiers last vear in which CCT members put together 27 Christmas Stockings, Mary felt confident that

CCT could step up to the challenge and put together 100 Christmas Care packages for Captain Grabos' brave soldiers in the 151st Engineering Company. It was decided that instead of stockings, the club membership would use 2-1/2 gallon zip-lock bags so we would provide each soldier with more items. We accepted this very worthwhile endeavor as a show of our support and appreciation to our brave men and women in the 151st Engineering Company. This was the least we could do for our brave soldiers in Afghanistan at Christmas time who are putting their lives in danger on a daily basis protecting our freedom.

CCT members and friends purchased and put into zip-lock bags: granola bars, snack packs, trail mix, gum, beef jerky, flavor packets for bottled water, DVDs, books, individually wrapped hard candy, cookies, nuts, shaving cream, shampoo, crossword puzzles, coffee, hot chocolate, tea, foot powder, etc. Some of the items that were donated consisted of 144 toothbrushes, toothpaste, dental floss, chapstick, hand warmers, sweetener, 100 fleece blankets, magazines and books. Mary also contacted the Grace Lutheran Church School again and the students created a whole stack of personalized Christmas cards for the soldiers. Much to our amazement, CCT members and friends brought 85 care packages in the 2-1/2 gallon zip-lock bags to the CCT membership meeting. Then some of the members met later and assembled another 25 zip-lock bags full of items. We exceeded our goal of 100 care packages, and actually ended up with 110 care packages plus extra items that we also packaged for shipment!

Now, we realize we have even a bigger challenge!! In 2011, we shipped 110 lbs via USPS to Afghanistan at a cost of \$250. We now have 830 lbs of Christmas Care Packages that need to be transported to Afghanistan. After packing all the items into 25 large shipping boxes, we took them to Reher Morrison Racing Engines in Arlington, TX who graciously had the shipment FedEx'd to Captain Grabo's home base in North Carolina. Refer Morrison added t-shirts

and magazines for all of the soldiers to the shipment. The US Army then transported the shipment to Afghanistan via a cargo plane for the 151st Engineering Company in time for Christmas.

We thank all of the CCT members, friends, neighbors and **Reher Morrison**, the businesses who donated items and the Arlington Grace Lutheran School students who helped demonstrate their support for our troops by preparing the personalized Christmas Greeting cards.

The Capital City Corvette Club of Lansing, MI was formed in 1958 and has continued a tradition of fun and fellowship for fifty-five years. Club members gathered recently at the historic state Capitol Building which was built between 1872 and 1878. In 1992, the National Park Service designated the Capitol a National Historic Landmark for its architectural significance and restoration.

Capital City CC is a charter member of the National Council of Corvette Clubs and is designated as club number MI-003. When the club was formed in 1958, Jim Hoppin was its first president. Jim was also secretary for NCCC when it was formed in 1959 and was instrumental in creating the NCCC steering wheel logo. Jim Hoppin continued his role with NCCC by serving as president in 1962 and 1963. The club was delighted to have Jim as a guest speaker at one of our monthly membership meetings in 2011 and he and his wife, Judy, were able to join us for our photo.



When the NCCC Convention was held in St Louis in 1961, thirty-three members of Capital City CC made the trip in twenty-three Corvettes. In 1962, the convention was held in Lansing, MI and hosted by Capital City CC. The July 1962 issue of "Blue Bars" featured an article about the Capital City Corvette Club and the upcoming convention. Their guest speaker was Zora Duntov who was accompanied by his wife, Elfi. Participants caravanned in their Corvettes to the assembly plant in Flint, MI.

Other club members also played an active role in NCCC. Art Miller was NCCC president in 1964 and 1965. Gary Cross was president in 1966. The NCCC President's Award was given to Darwin Thomas in 1964 and to Gary Cross in 1965.

The club's first sponsor was Lee MacGillivray Chevrolet in Haslett, MI. The early meetings were held at the dealership which allowed the members to use the service bays to wash and work on their Corvettes. A real plus during Michigan winters! Early club members enjoyed car shows, rallyes and racing. Some of them even raced their Corvettes on frozen Lake Lansing. Josh Joslin had a 1963 Corvette that he raced at Virginia International Raceway, the SCCA Divisional at Meadowdale and the Road America 500 in Elkhart, WI.



The Owens-Corning Fiberglas Corporation had a close relationship with General Motors and the early Corvette clubs because Owens – Corning was producing the body panels for the Corvette. Members of the Capital City CC traveled to their manufacturing facility for a tour. Owens-Corning gave an annual award to the club that had shown the most enthusiastic support of the Corvette hobby. Capital City CC was given a Steuben crystal bowl in 1961 and 1962 in recognition of receiving this honor.

We are part of the Michigan Region and the club's 101 members enjoy a wide range of activities including car shows, rallyes, parades, region events and road tours, which typically result in a unique dining experience. Club members also participate in the NCCC convention and events like Corvettes at Carlisle, Bloomington Gold and the Black Hills Corvette Classic. Our current sponsor is Bud Kouts Chevrolet in Lansing, MI. We host numerous events to raise funds for local charities such as VFW National Home for Children, the Greater Lansing Food Bank and the Potter Park Zoological Society. The club sponsors two scholarships at the local career center for young people who are continuing their education in the automotive field.

The Capital City CC has touched many lives in the past fifty five years. Its current members look forward to continuing our rich legacy of friendships, service and the enjoyment of Corvette ownership.
