To be held at Split Rock Resort, Lake Harmony, Pa. Saturday August 22 thru Thursday August 27, 2015

Activities include an indoor Corvette show on Sunday, Rallye and Picnic at the lake with games on Monday. The activity will move to Pocono Raceway Tuesday for the high and low speed events and tours of the track. Wednesday there will be Drags at Numidia Dragway. Thursday is golf, convention awards and final dinner.

During the week there will be a National Champions dinner and a theme (TBA) dinner at the resort.

There are committees working on local trips and tours.

Corvettes at Carlisle starts Friday and is 2 hours away.

#### Join us in the Poconos for our 2015 National Convention

The host hotel is the Split Rock Resort in Lake Harmony, PA. Our hotel contract will include three days prior to and after the convention days for you to enjoy the room rate of \$99.00 plus local taxes, so you can take advantage of an early visit or late stay at the discounted rate. Check-in time is after 11:00am. Check-out time is before 11:00am.

Note: This rate is only for those registered for the NCCC convention. Also, for the registrants, the hotel will provide a discount for selected items if you are wearing your convention badge.

There are several different room choices available. The Galleria rooms are at the location for the concours, starting point for the rallye and most activities. Other rooms are available that are still on site, but may be a mile away from the previously mentioned activities. The Lodge is near the area where the picnic, funkhana and valve cover races will be held. The Willow Brook is about a mile from the Galleria and is not adjacent to convention activities. If you have a room location preference, identify them when you make your hotel reservations.

There is ample parking for tow rigs as well as Corvettes around the Galleria. If you plan to use a tow vehicle, please identify such during convention registration.

The hotel has a full indoor water park as well as a movie theatre and an ice cream parlor. No youth program is planned. However, if you want to make this a family vacation, Split Rock has a number of activities available for youth during the day. Children from 3 to 16 years of age are permitted in the Hospitality Room and can receive soft drinks and snacks. They may accompany you to most functions but are not permitted in the evening adult parties without a parent or guardian.

Tucked into the Pocono Mountains, there are opportunities for white water rafting, kayaking and canoeing near the Resort.

The host hotel has a 27-hole challenging golf course with undulating fairways, water hazards and spectacular view.

**Convention Registration:** The best way to complete the convention registration form is to do so online. Complete details can be found at corvettesnccc.org. Registration will open February 1, 2015. Convention registration prices are per person and are date sensitive. The earlier you register, the greater the discount you will receive with breakpoints on April 1 and June 1.

There will be a link to Corvettes at Carlisle for a gate pass and preferred parking.

#### Corvette Cruisers donate \$10,000 to Gwinnett Community Clinic

The Corvette Cruisers of Atlanta have just completed a fundraiser for the Gwinnett Community Clinic, with the assistance of Norman Freid, MD. The fundraiser, over a 6 month period, was a raffle for a golf cart, donated by Kart Guys in Loganville. The Corvette Cruisers presented a check for \$10,000 to the Gwinnett Community Clinic in December 2014. Corvette Cruisers of Atlanta formed 6 years ago and is charity driven. Earlier this year they donated \$2,500 to the City of Lawrenceville, through Paws Alive, for vests and other miscellaneous equipment for their patrol canines. They are already working on their fundraiser plans for 2015, including an all Corvette show at the Old Towne Tavern next April, for a family's father who is totally disabled from a tragic fall at their home, while performing outside yard work. 

What the heck is this FCOA you keep hearing about???" Sit back, relax and "brush up" on one of my favorite subjects! The only assignment that will get you an "A" in this class is submitting a FCOA membership application for your kids, grandkids, nieces and nephews who are under the age of 16. And the only pop quiz question is "Why is there a dolphin in the FCOA logo?" (Hint: Your "cheat sheet" is NCCC's Standing Rules if you don't know the answer!)

<u>LESSON #1</u>: FCOA (FUTURE CORVETTE OWNERS ASSN.) is the youth organization of NCCC. It's a unique "Corvette Club for kids" formed to interest the younger generation in the Corvette hobby. This is the generation that is the Corvette enthusiast of the 21st century! FCOA members are the foundation of NCCC's future and hopefully FCOA members will join NCCC as a Youth Member when they have their 16th birthday!

<u>LESSON #2</u>: Concern for NCCC's future led Southeast Region members Don and Betty Parks to envision a way to involve more kids in the Corvette hobby. In 1991, with this in mind, they led a group of NCCC members to develop a new youth membership concept and FCOA was "born". The first 76 members were signed up at the 1991 NCCC Convention in Charlotte NC. In 1992 FCOA was designated as the "official" junior organization of NCCC. Marleen DeZeeuw was the first "Director" of FCOA. Karen Port took over that volunteer position in 1995, laying groundwork for me to build on when I picked up the reins in 1997.

<u>LESSON #3</u>: The original \$2 FCOA dues cost was increased to \$5 fee in October, 1991 and then to the present one-time \$10 fee in 2011. WOW! No dues increase in 20 years! How was that possible? Since 1997 Mid America Motorworks has been FCOA's main sponsor, providing membership cards and patches as well as helping with postage costs. FCOA "benefits" such as the other items included in the membership packet are supported by other automotive-related businesses as well as some NCCC Regions and Clubs plus some NCCC members. Fund-raisers for FCOA include selling some Corvette books for kids and a Corvette history coloring book created for the enjoyment of both kids and adults. In 2003 FCOA held a raffle for a 1953 Corvette pedal car, in 2006 FCOA had a raffle for a set of Goodyear tires and in 2012 the Quine family organized a raffle for a set of Kumho tires.

<u>LESSON #4</u> Since 1997, new FCOA members receive a membership packet tailored for different age groups. Included is a personalized welcome letter, FCOA patch, FCOA membership card plus a notepad, dash plaque, stickers, trading cards and other items supplied by those who support the FCOA program. It's not always possible but I try to get enough items so that all current members can receive a packet of "goodies" annually.

<u>LESSON #5</u>: Many FCOA milestones have been reached over the years. In 1999 FCOA assigned FCOA membership #1000, in 2002 FCOA #2000, in 2005 FCOA #3000, FCOA #4000 in 2009 and FCOA #5000 was assigned in 2013. Assigning membership numbers for FCOA is done a little different than NCCC as numbering is consecutive rather than separated by Region and/or Club. Since 1999 FCOA has "honored" every 100th member in *Blue Bars*, on its website and with some extra things in their new FCOA member welcome packet. In 1998 the Midwest Region was the first Region to attain 100 FCOA members; in 2009 it became the first Region to hit 500 FCOA members. In 2006 the West Region was the second Region to attain over 400 FCOA members.

Things change in NCCC over the years and FCOA is no different. FCOA has its own e-mail address (FCOAkids@aol. com) and its great website (www.corvettesnccc.org/fcoa1.html). In late 2005 a new FCOA logo was introduced along with a line of FCOA apparel for kids. A really fantastic "change" the last few years is that quite a few of the new FCOA members are <u>second</u> generation FCOA kids ~ now how great is that!?!?!? What does that mean? It means that the new member is the son or daughter of a former FCOA member who in many cases is now a NCCC member! Class is over! Don't miss out on that "A" ~ mail those FCOA membership applications in soon! What are you waiting for? Get those kids excited about our favorite car ~ you don't want them running around in a Viper, Porsche or Mustang, do you? THANKS TO ALL YOU NCCC MEMBERS for making FCOA a successful program for young Corvette enthusiasts! It <u>is</u> the foundation of NCCC's 21st century so get those young kids signed up now and then encourage them to join NCCC as a Youth Member when they have their 16th birthday!

What I enjoyed most about competing in 2014 was making many new friends and seeing how other regions run their events. A special





My plans for the future are: Continue competing and making new friends along the way





When Dylan had finished, East Region governors had only one recommendation—that Dylan create a "YouTube" video to tell his story in exactly the same manner as he had done in his presentation.

Dylan had a close attachment to his grandfather who was a Corvette aficionado. When Dylan was very young, his grandfather shared his love of Corvettes with Dylan. #### **Competition News**

Scheduling is complete for 2015 and we have 171 events on the calendar. 156 low speeds, three concours, two people's choice, and 10 rallyes, plus several Non-sanctioned events to enter. Event sites are still a problem due to repurposing, or repair. Insurance requirements are becoming stricter and costs are going up. Members must realize that we are guests at our event sites, and that one accident, burnout, or other bad behavior could get us banned from the site. We have more than 30 events less this year due to sites being unavailable.

For 2015, I have prepared Guidelines to help clubs be more consistent in running registration, driver meetings and tech. This should help new Governors and Chairpersons, and make event required tasks easier to understand and quicker to perform. Our initiative for 2015: In speed events, numbers displayed on cars must be 6" minimum, on the door of the car, and easy to read. Tech will no longer accept numbers on windows, rear hatch, or not easily readable at a distance. For 2015, there is a revised rulebook. I hope that all competitors check out the changes. You can access the rulebook on the NCCC website under Competition Manual. Result, registration and tech forms are

also available there. Since forms do change, please download a fresh copy of any form used for events. The next revisions of the Competition Manual will be for 2017.

MW members applied for 120 assigned numbers for 2015, the highest number to date. Thanks to all who participate. The policy of assigning vacant numbers at an event will continue, and a \$10 fee paid by MW members requesting a specific number at a speed event.

#### Corvette Racing's Oliver Gavin "hacks" his way to success

Long before "hacking" became a popular term, young Oliver Gavin experienced the most memorable "hack" of his distinguished racing career.

A former British Formula 3 series champion and McLaren Autosport Young Driver of the Year award winner, Gavin, a native of Cambridgeshire, England, was in France helping the Renault F1 team conduct some straight-line and development testing.

After a couple of prior adjustments, Gavin was seeking to get the F1 seat fitted just right; he asked the team for yet one more seat adjustment.

While the race cars were high tech, the process by which race seats were made was then not. A large, black plastic garbage bag was placed inside the car. The "part A" and "part B" chemicals were mixed and poured into the bag as Gavin settled inside the cockpit.

There was just one catch. "They started pouring and just kept pouring - way more than I was expecting," said Gavin. "As the foam started to form it quickly engulfed me in the cockpit. I was stuck in the car. There was foam everywhere. They had to free my hands from the steering wheel."

The team mechanics were all having a big laugh. One of them handed Gavin a hacksaw blade to cut himself out of the cockpit while they headed to lunch! "It took me nearly an hour and a half to cut myself out," laughed Gavin.

Since joining Corvette Racing in 2002, Gavin, now age 42, has been fitted for a lot of seats and helped the team find solutions or "hacks" to the endless cycle of racing challenges. Along the way he has claimed 44 GT race wins - 40 in the American Le Mans Series and four at the 24 Hours of Le Mans.

The 2014 debut of the new Corvette C7.R produced four wins for Corvette Racing's Jan Magnussen and Antonio Garcia, but surprisingly none for Gavin and co-driver Tommy Milner who had taken four wins and the 2012 ALMS GT Championship and a pair of wins in 2013.

Any disappointment over the 2014 season is long since passed as Gavin, Milner and the fabled Corvette Racing team work with Michelin to find further refinements, car set-ups and adjustments for the 2015 TUDOR United SportsCar Championship season.

"We are heading into the 2015 season with great excitement," said Gavin during testing at Daytona. We have a full year with the new Corvette C7.R under our belts."

To prove the point, Gavin then won the pole for the season opening Rolex 24 At Daytona, to become the 12<sup>th</sup> different driver to claim the GTLM class pole in the first dozen TUDOR Championship races.

Gavin and Milner, joined at Daytona by IndyCar star Simon Pagenaud, went on to lead the GTLM race at several stages before joining class winners Magnussen, Garcia and Ryan Briscoe on the 2015 Rolex 24 podium.

Quiet, confident and persistently hacking away at problems, and even finding a bit of humor in them, Oliver Gavin's 2015 high-speed hackathon is officially underway.
