This will give NCCC a constant address going forward for the future.

The new email, direct to all NCCC members, started in March this year and is doing well. I have received many positive responses from members who say it is nice to hear what is going on in NCCC as it is happening. In June, 9890 emails were sent and only 67 returned undeliverable. The first mailing in March had over 780 returned. Thank you to Walt Jenkins and all the RMD's for stepping up to ensure all NCCC members get the monthly update and report each month.

WE JOIN FOR THE CARS, AND WE STAY FOR THE PEOPLE! How true these words are. As an all-volunteer group of members, we give of ourselves so that everyone can have a good time with their hobby owning a Corvette. In September this year, National Offices are up for election. Offices up in 2016 are: President, VP of Membership, Treasurer, Public Relations, and Sgt. at Arms. NCCC is only as good as the people you elect to make decisions for the membership. 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
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### FROM THE DIRECTOR OF CHARITY

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






### FROM THE VP OF MEMBERSHIP

NCCC membership continues to grow as we go into the summer of 2016 with 18,640 members and 249 clubs at the end of May. Some of our clubs are holding steady at their beginning of the year numbers but there are many that have seen a surge in membership since January. Our largest club now is East Tennessee Corvette Club in Knoxville, Tennessee, with 404 members. Congratulations to ETCC and to all of our clubs and club members for continuing to make NCCC the largest Corvette organization in the United States.

The National Corvette Museum Delivery program that offers Corvette owners a "first year free" membership in NCCC has slowed down a bit. Since the program began in the spring of 2015 until the early part of 2016, I was usually receiving up to five or six new member applications a week. We had heard that NCM deliveries are not as strong so far this year as they were last year. Therefore, there are fewer responding to our NCCC membership. However,



we have quite a few more months this year to see additional members join us and then renew at the end of the year. Our NCM Delivery members who joined us beginning in the spring of 2015 until June 1, 2016, most of whom became Members-at-Large, will have to renew their memberships this fall. We really hope to have all of our NCM Deliveries renew either as MALs or as members of our clubs. Renewals will, of course, be the same as our other members, \$25 for a Primary and \$10 for a Spouse/Companion.

Reflecting back on the origins of the Corvette and the continued affection for the Corvette for more than sixty years, there are a lot of things we have to think about. As NCCC members and Corvette owners, we have to think about the American men and women who went off to World War II and returned victorious. They are, for the most part, that generation who are our parents. Whether they put on a uniform or stayed stateside during the war years, all contributed to making this country great and were the Greatest Generation. The American men and women who were part of the Korean War were making the world and the United States even safer for us. Millions stayed on in the US military and served at duty stations in Europe.

But, when they returned home, especially those coming back from Europe in the coming few years, had seen some of the European cars that were sleek and fast. The American car manufacturers needed to create cars that attracted the attention and wallets of the Greatest Generation. In 1953 and every year since then, except one, the

Corvette has been that car. Our parents from that time of the Greatest Generation would be quite proud of the Corvettes we have that their generation inspired. Grandchildren are continuing to buy and drive America's Sports Car.

I am also reflecting back to just a few days ago when I had the honor of speaking with a World War II veteran who was on his way from Philadelphia to Tampa. I saw he was wearing a *World War II Veteran* cap. I thanked him for his service and asked where he served during the War. He told me he had been in the U.S. Navy from 1943 to 1946 and then said "June 6, 1944, Normandy." Wow! He drove a Higgins Boat onto the beaches putting Army troops ashore. A few months later he was reassigned to the Pacific Theater. He then told me he was again driving a Higgins Boat but this time it was Okinawa. As he stepped onto the airplane, I shook his hand and again thanked him for his service. What an honor it was to have met this World War II veteran! I wonder if he or his children ever owned a Corvette.

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
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### FROM THE "IT" DIRECTOR

In the last issue I listed some of the things I'd like to accomplish that can really help our membership to find things easier, make them faster and provide as up-to-date information as is possible. To that end, I have enlisted four of our members to help me in this effort. Doug McMahan, Wayne Umland, Joe Vasta and Carole Debuse.

Doug McMahan is responsible for creating any needed documentation for the programs that are and have been developed. In previous jobs, Doug was a Technical Writer and has currently made modifications to the user manuals for the Family Helping Family program, the Competition Database program and the programs used by Online Registration.

Wayne Umland is responsible for Quality Control and testing. Wayne works for Hewlett-Packard and is a software engineer working in Storage products (e.g. disk drives and controllers).



Many of you know Joe Vasta and he is responsible for bringing design ideas for our website to the team. I have also enlisted CaroleDebuse for help with graphics design. Carole is responsible for designing the 2016 Convention logo and artwork and I believe will be invaluable for helping to create new items for our webpages.

In case you are wondering what I've been doing lately, here is some information for you: 1) the system used by Dave Heinemann to communicate with all of our membership via a monthly email message has been designed and implemented. We started out with only about 8400 email addresses from our membership database and almost 10% of those were not working. The second month, we were up to about 9600 email addresses and about 8% of those were not working. During the month of April, your Governors and RMDs fixed most of the non-working email addresses and out of about 9800 addresses, only 71 were not working. This is a really wonderful effort and I thank all of the folks responsible for getting the corrections done. I know we'll never get to 100%, but we sure are getting close!

I've also re-vamped the Family Helping Family interface and with the help of Denny Luther and Doug McMahan, we have a very good working system. If any of our members would like to sign up for this program, contact your Club Governor and they will get the ball rolling. The listing of program participants is now accessible from the Members Only webpage. One listing can be used to print out all of the participants in the program and the other listing is for when you are in the middle of nowhere and need some help and don't have the listing already printed out. I highly suggest that you check it out so when help is needed, it can be obtained quickly and easily.

Lastly, the Members Only webpage has been developed and it contains links to all of those programs that interface with the Membership Database, Competition Database, Online Registration Database and of course Family Helping Family database. I'm sure that there will be more items on that page as time goes on, so keep checking back frequently.



The event is modeled after the very successful, 10 year, St Jude Harley Ride from Peoria to Memphis.

The first annual St Jude Corvette Drive is an event for St Jude, initiated and endorsed by Mid-Illinois Corvette Club and underwritten by Gary Uftring of Uftring Chevrolet in Washington, IL.

Mike McCoy, Peoria County Sheriff, Peoria, IL, and member of St Jude Research Children's Hospital Board of Directors along with Angie Wiebler, St Jude run/ride/drive manager, worked with Sandy Arnold and her committee from Mid-Illinois Corvette Club to organize the St Jude Corvette Drive.

The purpose of the drive was to raise funds for St Jude Children's Research Hospital in Memphis, TN. For each car that participated, the only requirements were to raise \$1500 and, of course, drive a Corvette. If you were a driver without a 'co-pilot' you only had to raise \$1000.

In Sheriff McCoy's words, "all you have to do is raise your money, show up for the drive and expect to have a good time." WE DID! What a special way to enjoy your Corvette, meet other Corvette enthusiasts and raise funds for a very worthwhile cause.

Thirty seven Corvettes, having raised a phenomenal \$50,000, left Uftring's in Washington, IL on the morning of May 3rd 2012 for the seven hour trip to Memphis. There were members from the Mid-Illinois Corvette Club, Washington, IL, Mid-West Corvette Club, Milan, IL and several Corvette enthusiasts who participated without a club affiliation. The event was open to anyone with a Corvette.

There were gas stops, potty breaks and a lunch stop along the way. The Corvette caravan had a police escort from Peoria to Memphis. The caravan was met outside Memphis by the Shelby County, Police Department motorcycle patrol to escort us the rest of the way to our hotel In Memphis. They stopped traffic at all the intersections for a 50 mile stretch so that the Corvettes were not separated and we all arrived together at the hotel. Quite an exciting show of riding expertise was displayed by these motorcycle officers in getting through and stopping traffic for the Corvettes. These guys are true professionals in every aspect!

After arriving at the hotel and getting settled in, we experienced some of the local color of Memphis; Beale Street, southern cooking at the ever famous Blues City Cafe, trolley rides, Graceland, etc. The following morning, May 4th 2012, we drove to St Jude Children's Hospital where we had an orientation session in the auditorium. Richard Gilbertson – MD, PH.D and director of Comprehensive Cancer Center spoke to us about the latest research and technology in treating childhood cancers. He was so good at explaining their approach to diagnosing and treatment of the kids. He paralleled diagnosing problems with and fixing our Corvettes to diagnosing and trying to 'fix' the kids. What a presentation!! We then took guided tours of the hospital. Afterward, the children that were able participated in a small car show. They viewed the Corvettes, sat in the, honked horns and had the most wonderful time pretending they were driving. One little girl told a Mid-Illinois Corvette Club member, "When I get well and grow up, I am working at this hospital and I'm buying a Corvette to bring here to show the kids". What an amazing outlook from a small child! The whole experience was very humbling. To see these suffering children with the attitude that they know they

The whole experience was very humbling. To see these suffering children with the attitude that they know they will get better, is mind boggling. They know nothing of self-pity. We as adults can take a lesson from their strength and resilience.

### Tip for the C7

Having just finished a project on my C7 coupe, I wanted to pull the car into the garage. Looking up, I noticed a tool was in the way in the garage. I jumped out of the car and took about 3 steps, when my wife warned me the car was moving. Turning around, I see my 2014 C7 rolling down the driveway. Panicked, I ran around the open door, and tried to jump into the moving car. The car was going too fast to make a clean entry, so, I attempted to get out. That failed as well because my foot was caught between the gas pedal and the foot well.

Half in/out of the car, hopping backwards, I eventually fell, and was now being dragged on my back, with my right foot still stuck in the car. At the curb, the car bounced pretty well and I was flipped over to my tummy. The foot, leg, knee, and hip were in some abnormal positions. The car stopped near the middle of the road, with the car door in the center of my back, pinning me to the ground. My foot was basically pointing backwards. In pain, I yelled for help. A neighbor from up the street came over and helped Susan raise the door high enough for me to escape. The consequence for using my body as a brake to stop the car resulted in MCL, ACL, and hip flexor strains, meralgia paresthetica, road rash, and lots of bruises. I suspect my preseason training for skiing reduced the severity of the injuries. BTW - the injuries were not that severe, because I've skied 28 days so far in this season.

What I believe happened is that in my haste, I pushed the emergency brake button (flapper switch) to release the brake rather than engage the break, as I shot out of the car. Subconsciously, I assumed that emergency brake was set because the car wasn't moving. From the owner's manual …"Hill Start Assist (HSA) HSA is an automatic feature activated when the vehicle is stopped on a grade. This feature is designed to prevent the vehicle from rolling, either forward or rearward, during vehicle drive off. ..." I've determined that the HSA releases after, roughly, a couple of seconds. About 3 steps out of the car, the HSA released, and the car began to roll.

My tip is to not rely upon lack of motion, but to observe the instrument cluster for emergency brake engagement. I was lucky, you may not be.

I have forgotten many of the details of that day, but I will always remember seeing the car for the first time on the stage at the Convention Center and it was mine! I was given the keys and when we tried to start it we found it was out gas!! After that issue was resolved I took the car to a local hotel and started working with the local Chevy dealership and Roger to get the necessary paperwork for the car so I could drive it back to Texas. The car had been on a NCCC tour before the Convention, and only had 5 miles showing. After checking the belts, tire pressures, and fluid levels we decided it was ready for the 1,000+ mile drive home. With a North Carolina 20 day paper plate, me a 26 year old with a Texas drivers license, driving a brand new Corvette Pace Car, which at this time was very much in the national news for the inflated prices dealers were getting for the cars, and driving through the deep south, I somehow had the presence of mind to ask Roger to write me a note on NCCC letterhead explaining how I was now the owner of this car. I never had to use the note, but I still have it along with all the documentation from Chevrolet on how Tom Henry ordered the car from GM, was delivered to Charlotte, and consigned to NCCC, thanks to Jerry Britner sending it all to me in 1995. When I returned home and titled the car in Texas, I had an issue with the state in them determining the "fair market" value of the car for sales tax purposes. The sticker showed \$14,627.21, but several Houston dealers had sold them for \$22-25,000. I didn't like the state's number and asked for help. Roger again came to my assistance and got Chevrolet marketing to certify the actual build cost to NCCC of \$11,170.09 Texas backed down and accepted the certificate but even more important so did the IRS for income tax purposes. So much for a "free" car. I applied for and received my personalized Texas plates WON-IT and they have been on the car ever since. After a year or so of babying the car and enjoying the attention it got, I got the auto-X bug, and decided to run the Pace Car. The original motor was pulled and replaced with a purpose built motor, the exhaust and several other parts were altered for competition. I ran the car in the I C class, for 13 years, mostly in the SW region, but did run at Conventions in Florida where we ran Daytona and Sebring. The last time the car was pushed in competition was in May 1994 at Hallett Speedway, outside of Tulsa. Nowadays with 31,000 miles it sits in my garage most of the time and waits for a short drive around town. It sits next to my 2007 Z51 which is a much different car, but can't touch the memories of my time behind the wheel of WON-IT.

I would be interested if NCCC has any records of other raffle car winners over the past 37 years, and what ever happened to the cars. I would also like to hear from others who were at the 1978 convention and have any memories to share. I'll close by thanking the many people that helped me have the experience of winning the first Pace Car Corvette. Roger has been gone for many years but I will always remember him and the wonderful things he did not only for me, but for the entire NCCC organization.

I would also like to thank Sylvia Hoaldridge for her many years work and service as the Blue Bars editor.



In previous articles, I've written about charitable activities by clubs. This time, my subject is a charitable activity by one person - Jim Roberts of the Lancaster County Corvette Club.

Jim began running the annual Tire Rack 1 Lap of America (OLOA) endurance race eight years ago. OLOA, created by Brock Yates, a senior editor of Car and Driver magazine, is a unique competition loosely based on the movie Cannonball Run and was first run in May 1971. Competitors consist of two-(wo)man teams that race for a week running a different track each day starting and ending the week at the Tire Rack facility in South Bend, Indiana. Entrants are sometimes family teams including father-daughter, father-son and brother-brother teams. This is a somewhat cult race with many of the same competitors running year after year. One entrant has run OLOA 26 times including 21 times in a row. OLOA is an international event with entrants not only from coast-to-coast within the U.S, but also including entrants from the UK (including 'Big' Chris Smith's 700+ HP Mustang from Gas Monkey Garage), Sweden and Switzerland (including Robert Dubler of Dubler Chocolates). The 2016 version of OLOA was officially listed as 2827 miles plus travel to and from the event which for Jim was over 4000 miles. This year's tracks including Pitt Race, Palmer Whiskey Hill Road, Summit Point, NCM Motorsports Park, Road America, Great Lakes Dragaway and the Autobahn Country Club tracks in the NCCC Indiana, East Ohio, Northeast, East, Southeast and Midwest regions. Tires must be purchased from Tire Rack and the same tires must be used all week for both racing and travel to each track – no substitutions! Teams must have two people but can be up to 4 people in sedans. Cars cannot be trailered between events. Competition includes road courses, low speed auto-Xes and drag races and is open to all types of cars including Corvettes, Porsches, Nissan GT-Rs, McClarens, Vipers, BMWs, Mustangs, Audi R8s, Camaros, Pontiacs, Dodges, Mercedes Benz, Ford Festivas, Toyota Siennas, Subarus, VW Jettta TDIs, etc. Money can be no object in obtaining a win. For instance, one competitor replaced a transmission costing \$30,000 to complete the event (the cost of the transmission replacement was more than the original cost of Jim's Corvette)! After a team runs one event, they pack up and travel to the next venue which may be 600+ miles away so arrival may be 2:00 am. The next event typically starts at 8:30 am guaranteeing sleep deprivation each day. It is a major accomplishment just to complete the full course. This year about 15% of the competitors did not finish due to problems including major parts failures and significant crashes at tracks.

Many teams sponsor a charity and Jim Robert's charity is the Pennsylvania Breast Cancer Coalition (PBCC) which he has supported for all eight years running OLOA. Jim posts stickers on the roof of his car (2000 yellow Corvette – JimBob Racing) for the season for each person that donates at least \$10.00 to the PBCC. Jim raised over \$3,000 this year and has raised more than \$16,000 in the last six years competing in this event - a demonstration of what a committed individual can accomplish!

By the way, Jim finished 27th overall and 4th in his class due to strong performances in the dry skid pad and the drags. A remarkable finish for a 16 year-old Corvette racing against very expensive competition! (In the attached picture, the 2016 OLOA JimBob Racing team is wearing their pink PBCC tee-shirts!)
