

From the President



2016 is now in the rear view mirror and we are looking forward through the front windshield at 2017. It is always good to look back to see where we have been to help to know where we are going and what has changed.

NCCC is still the same great organization it has been for over fifty years. Change is good and here are some of the new things happening in 2017.

By now every member who renewed their membership for 2017 should have their new NCCC membership card. You may have noticed that there is not a year printed on the card. The new cards are permanent cards going forward. This permanent card will save NCCC around \$30,000 every year in producing the card and mailing to every member. Each year when you renew in the future, a notice will be sent via email to confirm your membership is received. If a card is lost or damaged, all you need do is contact your club Governor

who can get you a new card. If you are a Member at Large (MAL), you can contact the VP of Membership directly who will mail one to you.

The next thing that has changed is the way Blue Bars is produced going forward. If you notice there is now three staples holding the pages together and each issue is now pressed flat so that everyone should get their Blue Bars in the mail without the damage from the Post Office that members have experienced in the past. With the new improvements and working with the new owners of Kennedy Printing, NCCC has been able to reduce costs of printing saving NCCC around \$20-30,000 dollars each year depending on the numbers of pages printed. Also working with the Regional Membership Directors and Governors, NCCC has been able to correct many of the addresses in the database so every member receives Blue Bars every quarter.

In April of 2016 I appointed a new Director of Charity to head up the new NCCC raffle program to raise funds for St. Jude Children's Research Hospital in Memphis TN. At the November 12th Governor's meeting in St Louis, NCCC member Jacqueline Hoyt from Nebraska won the certificate for a new Corvette. The second raffle to raise funds for St. Jude has started and the winner will be drawn at the 2017 NCCC Convention that is being held August 21 – 25 in Bowling Green, KY. What's new is members can now go online on the NCCC website under Charity and order tickets for the raffle. And if you buy your \$50 ticket prior to the February 25th 2017, you can add a \$10 ticket for a chance to win \$250 cash at both the February and May meetings. We want every member to have a chance to win!!!

New in 2017 is the ability to apply for a NCCC Scholarship award online. All the forms required and directions to apply can be filled out electronically and returned from teachers and professors online. No more mailing. An applicant will also be able to see that all forms are filled in correctly and all recommendations are returned. NCCC awarded 15 Scholarships to family members in 2016. And don't forget that NCCC also has a "HARDSHIP" program for members who may have a loss from a fire or flood or some other kind of hardship. NCCC is here to help!

Business Manager Jack Wilson requested competitive bids in 2016 for our insurance and NCCC found out that the program with Legacy Insurance was and is the best deal for 2017. NCCC risks have been so low that the insurance liability coverage was increased to \$6 million each year. I challenge any one to find coverage that NCCC has 24 hours a day, 7 days a weeks for covering over 18,000 members and 250 clubs for the price we pay. And it covers NCCC members in all club related activities with liability none of us could afford to buy. It also covers all NCCC National, Regional, and Club officers if ever there is a lawsuit. Keep in mind, the largest and the most claims over the history of NCCC have been for social events, parades, car shows, and club outings. No major claim has ever been paid out for any of the competition programs. The competition program is the smallest risk for NCCC.

The last item I will share with you is this year, 2017, the NCCC Annual Corvette Convention is being held in Bowling Green KY, Home of the Corvette, the National Corvette Museum, and the NCM Motorsports Park. Not

only is Kentucky a beautiful state to visit, but this year you can see the sites, visit the Corvette plant, tour the NCM museum, play with your Corvette on the skid pad, and join in all the fun and activities offered during the five days of Convention. Plan to attend this year as it should be one of the largest attended Conventions NCCC has had in a long time and is in the heart of Corvette Country. I know you will have a good time if you attend. I promise it! You can register online under "Conventions" on the NCCC website.

My first two years as your President has ended and as I start my last two years, I look forward to continuing to improve everything you receive as a member. NCCC has been a huge part of my life for over 40 years. I want every member to experience all the fun times and good friends I have made as a member of NCCC. There is not a better group of folks anywhere.

I want to thank you all for the support you have shown myself and the NCCC Board of Officers who work hard as volunteers improving everything for all members to enjoy and feel good about belonging to this organization. Please...get involved with your club...go to events...and get to know your members. Look for the good in everyone and NCCC. That is what it is all about, having fun with your favorite car, the Corvette.

The 2016 Raffle Program was a success. 1250 Raffle tickets were sold in only five months. Many THANKS to everyone who purchased a ticket(s) and helped sell tickets. Congratulations to Jacqueline Hoyt who was the winner of the 2016 Raffle!! Jacqueline is a NCCC member, and a member of the Cornhuskers Corvette Club.

The 2017 kickoff event for the St. Jude Raffle takes place on January 21 at Ecklers 30th Corvette Reunion in Titusville, Florida. 


Mr. and Mrs. Stone still enjoy classic cars and others who enjoy them. They have attended the Concours events at Amelia Island as well as many others.








IT INFO

Miracle Strip Corvette Club Celebrating 50 Years

A popular 1960s hit song "Daydream Believer" became a reality for a group of young men who shared a fondness for Corvettes, a willingness to work jointly rebuilding cars, and the camaraderie of road rallies and speed events. Farrell Hardiman, Lee Resoa, Ray Sisk, and Mike Ungeman, of Pensacola, Florida spent their weekends competing in activities sponsored by Autocross of America. Since the coastal area has long carried the nickname "Miracle Strip," the men formed the Miracle Strip Corvette Club (MSCC) in 1967 and became a part of the National Council of Corvette Clubs.

Their original focus was hosting high and low speed events. Early on, organizers officiated at trials using an old fashioned stop watch. Municipal landing strips were popular locations for autocross. In addition, parking lots at local shopping centers were available on Sundays. These events were extremely popular for local residents and served as an attraction during winter months for enthusiasts who wintered in the area.



Graduating to righteous timing equipment, the growing club extracted Corvette performance at the Casino Beach parking lot on Santa Rosa Island and Bronson Naval Air Station. Interest in the organization began to expand when residents in the area learned there was a group promoting sanctioned speed events and rallies. Later, with the cost of cars increasing, combined with the expense of fuel and maintenance, many owners became hesitant to race their cars. Then in the late 1970s, the availability of racing venues declined. Shopping centers, which previously closed on Sundays, began opening their doors seven days a week, and the military resumed use of the once abandoned Bronson airfield for training.

Judy and Bruce Olson joined MSCC when she received a 1970 Donnybrook Green Convertible, as a birthday gift from her husband. Taking an enthusiastic role, she saw opportunities for social activities and encouraged other wives to become active. With membership dwindling, it became apparent the group needed a new direction to survive. Shortly after joining, Judy became the first female president in 1989. Now, 41 years later, the Olson's are the longest continuously active members. All three of their son's share a common interest in Corvettes and enjoy reminiscing with their parents about the good times they've shared driving and working on their cars as a family. Their oldest son Mike serves as the official club photographer.

Bob Dylan's 1960s pop single, "Times they are a-Changin" became more apparent as couples began to attend meetings introducing new endeavors to enjoy. Diane and Jim Kalivoda, who joined in 1981, along with Carol and Terry Mills, members since 2003, introduced annual events which give the club continuity while building lasting friendships amongst members. Many activities have grown into club traditions. This includes "Mystery Tours" to new dining adventures and touring Mississippi, Alabama and Florida's many scenic back country roads. Yearly favorites include the February Valentine's Day, May Pre-Mother's Day, and June Pre- Father's Day dining adventures.

The annual Pot Luck Dinner provides everyone the opportunity to demonstrate his or her cooking skills. Guests enjoy delicious creations from home made seafood cervichi, award winning bar-b-q and to-die-for desserts. Over mouth watering dishes, lengthy discussions debate the pros and cons of the latest changes to the C7 models. A highlight each year is attendance at a local Blue Wahoos' game. They are a Class Double-A affiliate of the Cincinnati Reds Major League Baseball. Cheering the home team at the Pensacola Bayfront Stadium, MSCC rents a party deck graced with ballpark food, beverages and souvenirs. The group enjoys a spectacular display of fireworks to top off the day.

A recent event addition is the annual Chili Cookoff. Crock pots and Dutch ovens fill the air with a bouquet of aromas to tempt hungry guests. Once diners finish taste testing, everyone votes for their favorite. Selections range from white, mild to hot and spicy, along with such novelty flavors as sweet potato chili. Chefs remark that "they enjoy the contest because they can make the chili ahead of time which allows them to relax the day of the event."

Every September the club hosts "Vettes at



the Beach" car show on Santa Rosa Island. Here the emerald green waters and the glistening white sand of Pensacola Beach forms the background for this prestigious show. The weekend features a dinner and pre-registration for participants and their guests on Friday evening before the Saturday event. This attracts exhibitors who travel over a thousand miles each year to participate. This past year over 250 entries from 34 Corvette clubs representing 15 states entered the show which serves as the major fundraising base for the year enabling members to make check presentations to two primary charities The Covenant Hospice Program in Pensacola and the Santa Rosa Kids House in Milton, Florida.



The Florida Panhandle consists of several military bases including the Naval Air Station, home of the Navy's Blue Angels Flight Demonstration Squadron, and the initial training site for all Naval Aviators, Near-by are Hurlburt Field, Eglin and Tyndall Air Force Bases. Anyone who has watched "Top Gun" knows aviators have a "need for speed." During the 1960s, the trendy sports car gained popularity as a preferred form of transportation for many of the Student Naval Aviators who purchased a new Corvette upon graduation from Flight School. It was a familiar sight to see these vehicles glistening in the Florida sun outside the barracks in Pensacola. The aviators wanted a vehicle that would match the thrill of piloting an F-4 Phantom jet. No other American-made vehicle but the Corvette could accomplish on the ground the thrills of flying. Young graduates would compare the joy of being behind the wheel of their new car to the powerful thrust of the Phantom's engines versus the muffled sound of a newly acquired C-3.

A large portion of membership has included both active duty and retired military personnel. The organization's members enjoy a strong working relationship with local armed forces. In a show of support, the club sponsors the "Vettes and Jets" Show at the National Naval Aviation Museum with proceeds benefiting the facility. This car show gives participants an opportunity to see the museum's finest military aircraft up close. There have been several photo shoots of MSCC Corvettes in front of the Blue Angels F/A-18 Hornet aircraft.

As another show of support, the club participates in two events recognizing veterans who served our country. In the fall, a caravan travels from Florida to Bowling Green, Kentucky for the annual "Vets 'n Vettes" program. During December, members participate in the National Wreaths across America wreath laying ceremonies at Barrancas National Cemetery. By placing wreaths at veterans' cemeteries participants remember and honor America's fallen heroes, and teach children the value of freedom.

Today the "Daydream Believers" of the 1960s live on in 2017 through current members as the Miracle Strip Corvette Club celebrates their 50th anniversary.

2015 - 92 - 50 - 70 - JUST NUMBERS!

Van Gates bought a 2015 reddish Corvette last year from...you guessed it...Gates Chevy World. But the 92 year young Van, now retired after 50 years of running the family business, did the same as any other customer. He dickered a little with the salesperson. That's Van Gates – as regular a guy as you will ever find despite his success in the car industry and his popularity and leadership roles in the South Bend Mishawaka community., But back to that fancy Corvette; 'I had a guy say to me,' I know how old you are and you bought a Corvette at your age?' I told him when you hit 90, the President sends one of these to you for free," he says with a smile. At 92, Van knows this might be the last car he buys. But then again, Van isn't giving up on the idea of still driving at 100. Good health and keen interests keep him motoring along.

OK, so we now know about his most recent set of wheels. How about his first? "It was a Model A Ford that I bought to knock around in while I was a Northwestern University student," Van recalls. "I can't remember if I paid \$50 or \$100 for it." Because he was already in the Navy ROTC program and would later serve as an officer on a troop transport in the Pacific during World War II, Van got a break at the gas pumps when he would wear his uniform. "But my dad was upset that I had bought the car," he says. Not because it was a Ford – he just didn't think it was necessary for his son to have any kind of car while a college student. It proved invaluable, though, in wooing a South Bend girl, also a student at Northwestern, named Jean Inglefield. Van and Jean have been married over 70 years, have four children, 15 grandchildren and 36 great grandchildren. Gates is a family business. After the war, Van joined his father and worked for the next 50 years, taking over the reins when his father died in 1956. Two sons followed in his footsteps and now it's the fourth generation that keeps the Gates rich tradition going. 'I couldn't be happier," Van says of the family involvement. "Sometimes your kids will remember the long hours and the weekend work you put in while they were growing up and go a different direction, so we were very fortunate." Van thought about that himself when he was finishing up high school. "For whatever reason, I had this wild idea of wanting to go to Alaska and drive a transport truck," say Van. "But my dad said to me that I was going to need money to go to Alaska and why not stick around for a while and sell some cars for him."

His dad probably had him figured out. Van soon got hooked helping people find their perfect car. So after college and the Navy, Van came back to his hometown and worked with his dad. After his half century of selling cars and making friends, he then kept an office in the old South Bend dealership for several years. "Now I just stop by and say hello...I don't direct things in any way. Everything is in good hands. What I really like is to talk to some of the guys who were here when I was still working. But it's important to let the younger people run with the ball," he adds. "Our customers aren't people of my era anymore. Things change. They know how to deal with it."

Over the years, Van has served on many committees and has received quite a few awards along the way. He has even written a book titled "Through the Rearview Mirror." Although his life has slowed down, his bucket list has a trip to the National Corvette Museum in Bowling Green, KY on it. "I would like to see that." Maybe in his own Corvette, singing "See the USA...in your Chevrolet," as he spins down the road.


